3 WHEREAS, in 1965, at the age of fourteen (14) years, Maureen Murphy 4 moved to Guam with her parents, Joseph and Marion Murphy, along with her siblings, Colleen, Shannon, †Kerry, Timothy, Erin, Megan and Joey, taking up residence in the
 beautiful village of *Agat*; and

WHEREAS, Maureen attended Mount Carmel Catholic School, George
Washington High School, and graduated in 1977 from the University of Guam; and

5 WHEREAS, as the daughter of Guam's most well-known and respected 6 journalist, the late Pacific Daily News Editor Joe Murphy, it's not surprising that 7 Maureen developed a passion for reading and teaching, placing her on the path to a 8 career in education; and

9 WHEREAS, true to her passion for reading and her love of books, Maureen
10 started her teaching career at the beginning levels, as her first teaching position was
11 teaching kindergartners at M.U. Lujan Elementary School; and

WHEREAS, after two (2) years at M.U. Lujan, Maureen moved on to teach the second (2nd) graders, the fourth (4th) graders, and the GATE students of P.C. Lujan Elementary School, where she spent six (6) years; and

WHEREAS, Maureen then worked with fourth (4th) graders for two (2) years at
B.P. Carbullido Elementary School; and spent two (2) years at the University of Guam
Child Development Center; and

WHEREAS, in her next-to-last, and her longest assignment, Maureen taught
middle schoolers at Agueda Johnston Middle School, a position she held for sixteen
(16) years; and

WHEREAS, for the past eight (8) years, Maureen has been teaching English
courses at *Liheng Famaguon* at the Department of Youth Affairs (DYA); and

WHEREAS, in each of her teaching positions, Maureen has made it her goal to
instill a love of reading within her many students, helping them learn that books are an

important means to open their young minds to the myriad of possibilities that exist in
 our incredible world; and

WHEREAS, one of Maureen's well-known teaching techniques is to have her students keep a journal regarding what they were reading, as well as chronicling the events transpiring in the lives of the characters; and

6 WHEREAS, this teaching method sometimes helps her students in recognizing 7 a part of themselves or their friends within the fictional characters, and also to learn 8 how they could become better people; and

WHEREAS, as busy as her career had been, Maureen had found the time to
have three (3) children, Melissa Finney Bettis, Kristan Finney and Dominic Finney,
and is married to Ernest Matson, Ph.D., a professor at the University of Guam; and

WHEREAS, although DYA may be the final stop in her career with the Government of Guam, Maureen is not the kind of person who is ready to jump into a life of retirement, and we all look forward to her next projects; now therefore, be it
