Relative to commending, honoring and extending Un Dångkolo Na Si Yu'os Ma'åse to Monsignor Brigido Pedro Untalan Arroyo for his fifty (50) years of service and stewardship within the Roman Catholic Church and the community of Guam.

WHEREAS, Monsignor Brigido "Bibi" Untalan Arroyo was born on October 4 23, 1933, to Brigido and Oliva Arroyo, and is the second in a line of siblings which 5 include his five (5) brothers: Ronald, Alfred, Joseph, (†)Jesse and Raymond; and one 6 (1) sister, Sister Marian Therese Arroyo; and

WHEREAS, it was through his family that he first developed his faith and 7 8 strong moral values; and

WHEREAS, any individual that has had the honor to work with or associate themselves with Monsignor Arroyo have words such as inspirational, faithful, compassionate, service-minded, family, modest, loyal, and courageous come to mind in describing the humbly dedicated man; and

5 WHEREAS, Monsignor Bibi has served in several parishes and in different 6 capacities in the last fifty (50) years, including the Dulce Nombre de Maria Cathedral Basilica in Hagatña; Our Lady of Guadalupe in Santa Rita; Nuestra Senora de las 7 8 Aguas in Mongmong; the Immaculate Heart of Mary in Toto; San Vicente in Barrigada; Blessed Luis de San Vitores in Tumon; San Dimas in Malesso; San 9 10 Dioniso in *Umatac*; the Guam Memorial Hospital; the Diocese of *Chalan Kanoa*; Santa Teresita in Mangilao; Our Lady of Purification in Maina; Nino Perdido in Asan: 11 12 and St.Anthony-St.Victor Church in *Tamuning*; and

WHEREAS, Monsignor Arroyo followed in the footsteps of his father and
brother by enlisting with the U.S. military, and served as the "moral compass" for the
U.S. Army on Guam as a Chaplain from 1983-1993; and he became the first Chaplain
of the Guam National Guard; and

WHEREAS, Monsignor Arroyo has also served as an educator at several Guam
Catholic Schools, including the Academy of Our Lady of Guam (1961-1970, 19771981), Father Dueñas Memorial High School (1961-1970), Notre Dame High School
and Bishop Baumgartner Elementary School; and he served as a teacher and counselor
at Lavrock Boy's Home and St. Therese Elementary School in Pennsylvania (19751977); and

WHEREAS, serving as the Director of Communications for the Archdiocese of *Agaña*, Monsignor Arroyo used the mass media to heighten the communication of the Roman Catholic Church's teachings, and he was able to reach followers and devotees through recent innovations; he utilized outlets such as the Pacific Voice and KUAM 610 AM & KATB (now K57) in the 1960s and 1970s, co-hosting the Rosary Hour;
 and

WHEREAS, one of the highlights of Monsignor Arroyo's position as Director of Communications was being part of the committee that welcomed and planned the itinerary for Pope John Paul II in 1981, personally providing the Pope with *Chamorro* phrases to use during the visit; and

WHEREAS, after graduating from Temple University in Philadelphia,
Pennsylvania, with a graduate degree in Social Communication, Monsignor Arroyo's
stance in social communication within the Church was further institutionalized; he
was called Guam's "Communicator of Christ"; and

WHEREAS, Monsignor Bibi is also a member of UND or SIGNIS the International Catholic Broadcast Association; he has been the Chaplain of the Daughters of Americas, Guam region, a group that gives attention to evangelization via media; he is a member of the Catholic Press Association, and is a Conference Presenter with numerous conferences around the world; and

WHEREAS, in October 2003, Monsignor Arroyo was given the first (1st)
Gabriel Award by the Diocese of Guam for his "tireless dedication as a servant of
Christ and passionate communication of the Good News of God's love"; and

WHEREAS, in May 2006, Pope Benedict XVI conferred the Papal honor of
 becoming Monsignori on Monsignor Brigido Pedro Untalan Arroyo, along with
 Monsignor David I.A. Quitugua, Monsignor James L.G. Benavente and Monsignor
 David C. Quitugua; and

WHEREAS, on paper alone Monsignor Arroyo's accomplishments evidence dedication, excellence and quality work, but it is in the opinions and testimonies of parishioners and other people who have interacted with him that we hear the details that explain Monsignor Bibi: "his life has been service to his God, his church and his people"; "never one to turn away a person in need"; "never one to give less then
 everything"; and "faithful servant and friend"; and

WHEREAS, reflecting on his life's works, Monsignor Bibi's has been quoted saying, "Fifty (50) years of priestly stewardship is nothing else than a surpassing worth of knowing, loving and serving Christ Jesus and His people"; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'Trentai Unu Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people of Guam, recognize, honor and commend Monsignor Brigido "Bibi" Pedro Untalan Arroyo for fifty (50) years of service and stewardship to the Roman Catholic Church and the island of Guam; and does further extend *Un Dångkolo Na Si Yu'os Ma'åse'* to him for his unparalleled contributions; and be it further
