1BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I2MINA'TRENTAI UNU NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, "Parks and Recreation Month" is traditionally celebrated annually during the month of July, and the Department of Parks and Recreation is continuing that tradition in the celebration of 2011"Parks and Recreation Month", by adopting the theme: "Protecting our Historic and Natural Resources to Enhance Our Quality of Life"; and 1 WHEREAS, the official purpose of "Parks and Recreation Month" is to invite 2 public participation in activities that enhance our people's quality of life at a 3 community level, and in so doing, heighten public awareness regarding the 4 importance of the Department of Parks & Recreation; and

5 WHEREAS, the Department of Parks and Recreation performs a wide variety 6 of park, recreation and historic preservation services for our community; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Parks and Recreation is committed to
improving the quality of life for our residents, and for our visitors, by promoting
healthy lifestyles, strengthening our families, maintaining our parks and natural areas,
and preserving our island's unique heritage; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Parks and Recreation continues to properly maintain and operate our parks and recreational facilities, while seeking funding to ensure that all parks, equipment and facilities are safe, attractive, accessible, and userfriendly; and to ensure that our island's historic sites are protected and restored for the benefit of present and future generations; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Parks and Recreation provides activities that can reduce stress, provide socialization opportunities, and improve the mental and physical well-being of our youth, adults, seniors and challenged individuals; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Parks and Recreation also recognizes the
importance of our rich heritage through the preservation of our many historic sites,
and acknowledging Guam's Pre-Contact, Spanish, Early American, Japanese/World
War II and Post War Historic Timelines; and

WHEREAS, for the past thirty-six (36) years, the Department of Parks and Recreation has been mandated by law to be responsible for seventy-six (76) active parks and over four thousand seven hundred ninety-four (4,794) acres of seashore, conservation and wildlife refuge, and is also responsible to protect and maintain over one thousand six hundred (1,600) historic sites in its inventory; additionally, they review over one thousand one hundred (1,100) building permits annually to ensure that historic sites are taken into consideration; and they also process over one thousand four hundred (1,400) park permits, more than twenty (20) vendor permits, and over one hundred fifty (150) facility permits annually, so that island residents and visitors alike can enjoy the outdoor environment, such as beaches and parks; and

7 WHEREAS, I Liheslaturan Guåhan recognizes the contributions of partners in 8 the community, such as Ms. Paula Faulk Creech of the American Samoa and 9 Micronesia Historic Preservation Program (National Park Service), who has committed much effort to assisting the Guam Historic Preservation Office; and like-10 11 partners that include the War in the Pacific National Park (National Park Service), the 12 Guam Preservation Trust, the Department of Chamorro Affairs, the Guam Museum, 13 the Guam Museum Foundation, the University of Guam, the Richard F. Flores Micronesian Area Research Center, and the Pacific War Museum that steadfastly 14 support the Department of Parks and Recreation and have contributed to the 15 16 preservation, protection and interpretation of Guam's historic and cultural resources, 17 as well as the beautification and maintenance of our parks and recreational facilities; 18 now therefore, be it
