Relative to recognizing, commending and thanking Dr. Nerissa Bretania Underwood for her dedication and leadership in the building of our island's future through the Guam public education system.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I

2 MINA'TRENTAI UNU NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

- 3 WHEREAS, Dr. Nerissa Bretania Underwood was born in the Philippines and
- 4 raised on Guam, where she attended Mount Carmel School and Notre Dame High
- 5 School; and she then attended Sacred Heart Forrest Ridge High School in
- 6 Washington, where she received her high school diploma in 1973; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Bretania Underwood earned a Bachelor's Degree in Elementary and Special Education from the University of Guam; and a Master of Science Degree in Education and a Doctor of Philosophy from the University of Oregon; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Bretania Underwood had served as a Guam Department of Education (DOE) special education teacher; as a school program consultant for teacher evaluation; as a research, planning and evaluation administrator; and as an assistant superintendent of special education; and

WHEREAS, in July 2008, Dr. Bretania Underwood was selected as the Guam Department of Education's eleventh (11th) Superintendent of the Guam Public School System, which has thirty-one thousand (31,000) students, four thousand (4,000) employees at forty-one (41) school sites and the central office, and a budget of One Hundred Ninety-six Million Dollars (\$196,000,000) in local funds, and One Million Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$1,090,000) in federal funds; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Bretania Underwood was the first Superintendent to institute compliance with Public Law 29-102, which allowed her to select her management team, which included Doreen Crisostomo, Geri James and Eva San Nicolas; and later Taling Taitano and Arlene Unpingco; and which began a term where the Superintendent exemplified performance accountability as high profile resignations and reassignments resonated towards the beginning and continues through today; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Bretania Underwood touted student progress as the graduation rate steadily increased to sixty-eight percent (68%); and emphasized student achievement opportunities as students were encouraged to pursue post-secondary education through the Dual Enrollment Program, the pilot year beginning with ten (10) students, and growing to forty-eight (48) students the following year; and

WHEREAS, during her tenure, Dr. Bretania Underwood had supported learning opportunities, such as the JROTC Marine Corps and Lodging Management Programs at Okkodo High School, where both student groups took first place in the 2011 national competitions; and the promising Science Technology Engineering Math (STEM) Academy being developed at George Washington High School; and

WHEREAS, also during her tenure, SAT 10 scores showed a marked improvement with first (1st) graders at F.Q. Sanchez, Wettengel, Merizo, B.P. Carbullido, LBJ, and Inarajan Elementary Schools scoring at ninety percent (90%) of the national average in reading, and John F. Kennedy High School students scoring at the national average in science and social studies; and

WHEREAS, Direct Instruction was previously required for all schools; and now schools are allowed to choose instructional programs, and today in the *Metgot* Schools (those without a federal reform program), the growth rate ranges from a low of five (5) points to a high of sixty-one (61) points in math; and

WHEREAS, to ensure expectations are relevant and meaningful, student performance standards have been reviewed and updated to meet the challenges and opportunities of the 21st Century; as well, standards-based assessment through criterion reference tests will be launched; and the inclusion of learning opportunities through E-Books and laptops for all students; and during her tenure, leadership was a critical outcome providing for an improved financial system based on a strengthened and open-information system; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Bretania Underwood understood that a critical component was school facilities, and as her career as Superintendent began, an initial challenge for her was the maintenance of facilities, which had too few personnel and insufficient resources; and now there are standard operating procedures and a maintenance database, a full assessment of the conditions of our schools by Sodexo, and Public

- 1 Law 31-29 was enacted, which will identify a public-private partnership that will
- 2 finally provide the needed training and resources, and systemic shifts that will allow
- 3 the maintenance crew to succeed; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Dr. Bretania Underwood offered professional training
- 5 opportunities for all levels of employees, whether it was the Pacific Education
- 6 Conference or quarterly professional development days; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Dr. Bretania Underwood's belief that High Risk meant High
- 8 Visibility and High Standards set a constructive tone that helped the school system
- 9 succeed as it understood that external assistance was needed to turn the tide; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Dr. Bretania Underwood's strength and focus kept the public
- school system moving forward as it encountered food poisoning, bullying, school
- 12 closures, and money challenges; and
- WHEREAS, Dr. Bretania Underwood's confidence in the teachers, school
- staff, school leaders, and central office staff provided an environment where schools
- were encouraged and expected to grow and learn; and
- WHEREAS, Dr. Bretania Underwood's basic belief in the goodness of all
- students and their families kept the public school system as a trusted guardian where
- the vision to prepare all students for life, promote excellence, and provide support is

- 20 **RESOLVED,** that the Committee on Rules of I Mina'trentai Unu Na
- 21 Liheslaturan Guåhan does hereby, on behalf of I Liheslaturan Guåhan and the people
- of Guam, recognize, commend and thank Dr. Nerissa Bretania Underwood for her
- 23 dedication to the education of our children and families; and does further wish the best
- of health and happiness to Dr. Nerissa Bretania Underwood and her family for the rest
- of their lives; and be it further
