Relative to recognizing the accomplishments of the Northern Mariana Islands Council for the Humanities on the occasion of the Council's Twentieth (20<sup>th</sup>) Anniversary, to be celebrated on August 12, 2011.

## 1 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I

- 3 WHEREAS, in April 1991, the Northern Mariana Islands Council for the Humanities

4 was established in the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, and they will

5 celebrate their Twentieth (20<sup>th</sup>) Anniversary with a special dinner event on August 12,

6 2011; and

WHEREAS, the Council has maintained its nonprofit status under the 501(c)(3) tax status since 1991, and its mission is to "foster awareness, understanding and appreciation for the humanities through support of educational programs that relate to the humanities of the indigenous cultures and to the intellectual needs and interests of the people of the Commonwealth"; and

6 WHEREAS, the Council is governed by a thirteen (13) member Board of
7 Directors, and the current Officers are: Tracy M. Guerrero, Chair; Jerold Facey, Vice8 Chair; and Joann T. Aquino, Secretary-Treasurer; and

9 WHEREAS, the Council is affiliated with and receives annual grant support 10 from the U.S. National Endowment for the Humanities, and they have awarded 11 approximately Eight Hundred Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$890,000) in outright cash 12 awards for one hundred fifty-three (153) individual grants over the past twenty (20) 13 years; and

WHEREAS, the Council is designated as an "educational institution", thus making them eligible to receive public donations under the Education Tax Credit Program; and they administer a variety of high quality programs and educational initiatives, and has become a respected community-based organization that is recognized for their commitment to promoting lifelong learning in the humanities; and

WHEREAS, the Council, in advancing its mission, has established collaborative relationships with a wide variety of local, regional, and international institutions, organizations, and individuals, including the Richard F. Taitano Micronesian Area Research Center (MARC) at the University of Guam; and it has established a new collaborative relationship with the Guam Preservation Trust, which will involve organizing and conducting a Marianas-wide History Conference in 2012; and WHEREAS, the Council has given priority to the study, preservation, and appreciation of the indigenous language, culture, and history of the Mariana Islands; and has also sponsored programs that explore, document, and recognize the many contributions made by the non-indigenous residents of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands; and

6 WHEREAS, the Council has many current programs, among which are: the nationally-recognized Motheread/Fatheread Program that teaches parents and children 7 literacy skills; the Teachers Institute that provides kindergarten to twelfth (12<sup>th</sup>) grade 8 classroom teachers with a solid overview of the history of the Mariana Islands; a 9 10 weekly radio show that provides a wide-ranging humanities-based programming; the 11 Micronesian Authors Initiative that publishes the works of indigenous writers; the 12 diversified classroom programs that engage students in the humanities at an early age, 13 such as the Sengebau Poetry Competition, the Junior High Mock Trial Program, the 14 Covenant Day Debate, and programs exploring multi-culturalism; an initiative to promote geo-tourism in the Commonwealth to foster sustainable economic 15 16 development and to establish an authentic sense of place for both visitors and residents; the Community Lecture Series on humanities topics of interest to the public; 17 18 a National Science Foundation supported multi-year project to revise the 19 Chamorro/English dictionary; and a digital database of primary source documents and 20 images needed to facilitate the study of local history; now therefore, be it

**RESOLVED,** that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'Trentai Unu Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people of Guam, recognize the many accomplishments of the Northern Mariana Islands Council for the Humanities over the last twenty (20) years, and congratulate the Council on its widely-recognized historic and cultural preservation efforts; and does honor the Council for their desire to further service the Northern Mariana Islands with public programs that explore the community's expanding intellectual interests, such as
 diversity/multiculturalism and governance; and that engage national humanities
 initiatives, such as promoting civic discourse and bridging cultures; and be it further
