Relative to extending sincere gratitude, Un Dångkolo' Na Si Yu'os Ma'ase', and special recognition to the Family Violence Awareness Month Task Force members, Guam's practitioners, and the numerous advocates who have tirelessly provided support to the victims of family violence over the years, and who have also increased community awareness on the reduction and prevention of family violence; and further encouraging the people of Guam to actively unite in the elimination of family violence which negatively impacts the lives of many of Guam's children and families, as we commemorate the month of October 2011 as "Family Violence Awareness Month".

BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'TRENTAI UNU NA LIHESLATURAN GUÂHAN:

WHEREAS, it has been proven that family violence can take numerous forms, including physical, sexual, emotional or verbal, directed against a person who is the abuser's intimate partner, relative or friend, and could affect any person regardless of age, sexual orientation, physical ability, marital status, ethnicity, culture, education, religion or economic status; and

WHEREAS, research over the years has highlighted that children in homes where abuse among adults occurs, are often neglected at a rate much higher than the national average, and studies further show that children from violent homes have a notably higher risk of alcohol or drug abuse, and juvenile delinquency; with the results showing that these children are six (6) times more likely to commit suicide; twenty-four (24) times more likely to commit sexual assault crimes; and fifty (50) times more likely to abuse drugs or alcohol; thus stressing that children from abusive homes typically carry these terrible experiences of violence with them into adulthood, and affecting even the next generation; and

WHEREAS, recent statistics gathered through the Guam Police Department exhibit an alarming rate of violence in homes on Guam, in which family violence-related offenses account for two hundred four (204) cases of misdemeanor and felony family violence combined; five (5) cases of misdemeanor sexual assault; fifty-two (52) cases of felony sexual assault with arrest for abuse and neglect offenses against family and children; and two (2) deaths as a result of family violence; and

WHEREAS, the Superior Court of Guam, Courts and Ministerial Division, in the previous years recorded four hundred thirty-two (432) combined cases of felony and misdemeanor family violence, one hundred twenty-seven (127) combined cases of

2 felony and misdemeanor criminal sexual conduct, and eighty-three (83) protection

3 orders filed; in addition, the Probation Services Division reported eight hundred

ninety-nine (899) new family violence, sexual assault and child abuse cases, with

more than eight hundred eighty-three (883) defendants under supervision by the end

6 of 2010; and

WHEREAS, Alee Shelter, Erica's House, the Public Defender Service Corporation and the Attorney General's Office have provided eight hundred twenty-two (822) victims with direct services, and have facilitated additional referrals to other service providers; and

WHEREAS, family violence is often ignored and tolerated by our society, and many victims feel isolated, ashamed, and even responsible for the abuse, often blaming themselves; with many men and women being reluctant to admit to the incidence of family violence, and are further reluctant to seek help beyond their families, leading some experts to believe that the actual prevalence of family violence is much higher than the statistics indicate; and

WHEREAS, the Family Violence and Sexual Assault Task Force, STOP VAW sub grantees, government and non-government organizations, faith-based organizations, and other community partners have joined forces to directly and collectively confront this family violence crises. These community organizations include the following: Alee Shelter, Catholic Social Service; Andersen Family Support Services, Fleet and Family Support Services; the Archdiocese of *Agaña*; the Office of the Attorney General, Crime Victim Response Unit; the Department of Corrections, Parole Division/Training; the Department of Education; the Department

- of Mental Health and Substance Abuse, Healing Hearts Crisis Center; the Department
- of Public Health and Social Services; the Department of Youth Affairs; Erica's House
- 3 Visitation Center; the Governor's Community Outreach, Federal Programs Office; the
- 4 Guam Housing and Urban Renewal Authority; I Liheslaturan Guåhan; the Guam
- 5 Police Department, Victim Assistance Unit; Guma'Mami, Inc.; Inafa'Maolek; the
- 6 Mayors Council of Guam; Guam's Media; Mothers Against Drunk Driving (MADD);
- 7 the Public Defender Service Corporation; the Guam Judiciary the Superior Court of
- 8 Guam Client Services and Family Counseling Division, the Judicial Council, and the
- 9 Superior Court of Guam Probation and Marshals Divisions; Sanctuary, Inc.; the
- 10 University of Guam; and the Victim Advocates Reaching Out (VARO); and
