- 3 WHEREAS, Mr. Edward H. Taitano is a proud father of two (2) sons and one
- 4 (1) granddaughter, and he is married to Karen Y. Taitano; and
- 5 WHEREAS, in August 1980, Mr. Edward H. Taitano began his exceptional
- 6 career at the Department of Education, working at the Chief Brodie Memorial School,
- 7 where he was a Social Work Practicum Student, and whose duties included

counseling, advocating for the rights of the disabled, and preparing and planning the educational program packets for disabled individuals; and

WHEREAS, in October 1982, Mr. Taitano began working at the Department of Public Health and Social Services (DPHSS), Medical Social Services, as a Social Worker I preparing psychosocial assessments on patients in the Services for Handicapped Children clinics, conducting home visits, and providing counseling services to patients and their families regarding their family members' medical condition; and

WHEREAS, in October 1984, as a Social Worker II of DPHSS, Mr. Taitano continued his diligent work in the Medically Indigent Program (MIP), where his various duties included explaining and interpreting the MIP program policies and procedures to patients and their families; providing counseling to patients regarding their medical condition; and assisting patients to help alleviate emotional, social and/or financial problems related to their illness; and

WHEREAS, from August 1986 to March 1989, Mr. Taitano continued his outstanding work as a Social Worker III at DPHSS in the Residential Treatment Services Division, providing primary care to emotionally-disturbed children in the Guam *Manhoben* Program (GMP), and providing on-site counseling to assist with adjustment problems and immediate crisis intervention to clients and their families through the transitional phase of placement into the GMP; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Taitano provided subordinate social workers with guidance relative to GMP policies and procedures; assisted in the planning and coordination of GMP activities; assisted in planning, scheduling, and conducting case conferences with other disciplines for treatment planning and evaluation of clients; and acted as a liaison between the subordinate social workers, the residence staff and supervisor, and the administrator of the program; and

WHEREAS, from 1989 to 1993, Mr. Taitano continued his dedicated work to the residents of Guam as a Social Worker III at the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse in the Case Management Branch, where he conducted on-going client assessments and outreach follow-ups to ensure smooth client adjustment and social functioning into the community for the adult mentally ill population; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Taitano coordinated and participated in case conferences (i.e., Adult Inpatient Treatment meetings, Group Consults, Guam *Manhoben* and Day Treatment meetings) for treatment planning and evaluation of cases; he provided supportive counseling to clients, their family and/or significant others; and he assisted clients in overcoming the barriers of discrimination and stigma due to their mental disability; and

WHEREAS, from 1993 to 1994, Mr. Taitano began working at the Department of Youth Affairs (DYA) as a Social Worker III in Youth Development to assist and rehabilitate Guam's youth; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Taitano provided case management services to clients confined at the Youth Correctional Facility and Cottage Homes; and he provided each minor with casework representation at court by presenting both verbal and written reports of their progress and workers' recommendations during progress and dispositional hearings. Mr. Taitano assumed the roles of liaison and advocate, while collaborating with other agencies on the minor's behalf, and maintained daily contacts with Youth Service workers to insure compliance with all court orders, treatment plans and stipulations; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Taitano developed a Counseling Unit, with one (1) licensed therapist on board, and one (1) Youth Service worker to assist in coordinating the "Jumpstart" program, to transition clients back into their home environment, with community and agency support; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Taitano consulted with other specialists in the field of counseling to ensure consistency of standards and professional ethics within this unit and he continued to develop and modify the two (2) programs, based on client and staffing needs, relative to a youth correctional environment. Mr. Taitano developed a database of all clients confined at the DYA and conducted daily assessments to identify the treatments needed, and make the appropriate recommendations; and

WHEREAS, from 1998 to the present, Mr. Taitano has continued his illustrious career in social work as a Supervisor I at DYA, where he diligently continues his work relative to Work Planning and Performance Evaluation of subordinate staff in implementing and administering the Jumpstart Program; and he continues to develop, update and maintain the DYA Client Database and the Jumpstart Client Database; and WHEREAS, Mr. Taitano has fulfilled various other tasks at DYA, to include

WHEREAS, Mr. Taitano has fulfilled various other tasks at DYA, to include serving as Acting Administrator for Youth Development, as Court Officer, and as Acting Casework Supervisor; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Taitano has inspired the minds of students at the University of Guam, where he was an Adjunct Instructor and taught SO 386 – Juvenile Delinquency; and SO 400 – Fields of Social Work Practice: Youth Services for the Sociology Department; and

WHEREAS, since 2003, Mr. Taitano has been working in the Juvenile Drug Court (JDC) Program as an Individual, Marriage and Family Therapist, where he works with families referred by the JDC program to identify problematic areas, dysfunctional thoughts and/or behaviors; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Taitano's innovations at DYA, his inspiration as an Adjunct Instructor at UOG, and his work at DYA, DMHSA and DPHSS, along with his continuous participation in community activities, has made him an important altruistic asset to the residents of Guam; now therefore, be it
