Relative to commending and congratulating U.S. Navy Master Chief Robert Joseph Reilly on the occasion of his retirement; and to further extending a most sincere *Un Dangkolo Si Yu'os Ma'åse* to him for his thirty (30) years of service to the United States and Guam, and its people.

1 **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF *I***
2 ***MINA'TRENTAI UNU NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:***

3 **WHEREAS, Master Chief Robert Joseph Reilly was born on January 26, 1962,**
4 **in Brooklyn, New York; and he is the son of Victoria and Charles Reilly. He is**

1 married to the former Gina Tabonares; and they have a daughter, Meagan Reilly, and
2 a granddaughter, Abbey Lane, who live in Merritt Island, Florida; and

3 **WHEREAS**, in October 1981, Master Chief Reilly enlisted in the United States
4 Navy, and he attended the Recruit Training Command in Orlando, Florida. Upon
5 graduation, he volunteered for the submarine force and attended Basic Enlisted
6 Submarine School in New London, Connecticut. While there, he was selected to
7 attend Quartermaster “A” School and went back to Florida in March 1982; and

8 **WHEREAS**, Master Chief Reilly was assigned to the USS Von Steuben SSBN
9 632 Gold in Newport News, Virginia, as a Seaman Recruit. The ship was transferred
10 to Charleston, South Carolina, where he served from May 1982 to December 1985;
11 and achieving the rank of Quartermaster Second Class, he accepted orders to serve
12 aboard the USS Sturgeon SSN 637, also in Charleston, South Carolina, and served
13 onboard until July 1987. He was transferred as an emergency fill to the USS Francis
14 Scott Key SSBN 657 Blue; where he was promoted to Quartermaster First Class, and
15 he served as the ship’s Assistant Navigator until October 1989; and

16 **WHEREAS**, in 1989, then Quartermaster First Class Reilly assumed his
17 position as Submarine Exercise Area Control Coordinator at the Commander
18 Submarine Group TEN in Kings Bay, Georgia, and was responsible for the
19 management of all local area submerged water from Cherry Point, North Carolina to
20 Corpus Christi, Texas; and he was promoted to the rank of Chief Quartermaster. Chief
21 Reilly transferred in January 1992 to serve as the Assistant Navigator on the USS
22 Tennessee SSBN 734 Blue until April 1996, when he was selected to attend the
23 Defense Equal Opportunity Management Institute at Cape Canaveral, Florida; and

24 **WHEREAS**, Chief Reilly returned to the Commander Submarine Group in
25 August 1996, and served as the Equal Opportunity and Drug and Alcohol Advisor
26 until January 1999; and he was then assigned to the USS Kentucky SSBN 737 Blue as

1 the Operations Department Senior Enlisted Advisor and Assistant Navigator, and he
2 was then promoted to Senior Chief Electronics Technician. In March 2002, he
3 transferred to Naval Ordnance Test Unit at Cape Canaveral, and served as the
4 Assistant Port Operations Officer and DASO Test Engineer. He was promoted to
5 Master Chief and was requested to fill a critical billet at Commander Submarine
6 Squadron FIFTEEN, and so he transferred on March 2005. Master Chief Reilly
7 executed his duties at Submarine Squadron Fifteen as the Squadron Operations
8 Officer and Assistant Operations Officer for the only forward deployed Submarine
9 Squadron in the Navy until October 2008; and

10 **WHEREAS**, Master Chief Reilly held his last military position as the Assistant
11 Training Officer of Joint Region Marianas Training & Readiness, overseeing all
12 Department of Defense military units, foreign military units, and numerous other
13 government activities in the Marianas Range Complex for Joint Region Marianas; and


14 **WHEREAS**, Master Chief Reilly always ranked at the top of his field during
15 his entire Naval career; and he had completed sixteen (16) years of service at sea, and
16 had received numerous accolades and medals, including the Meritorious Service
17 Medal; five (5) Navy Commendation Medals; five (5) Navy Achievement Medals;
18 three (3) Battle Efficiency Awards; ten (10) Good Conduct Awards; two (2) National
19 Defense Medals; two (2) Global War on Terrorism Medals; six (6) Overseas Service
20 Ribbons; the Expert Rifle and Pistol; and the Gold SSBN Deployment Pin for a total
21 of twenty-five (25) SSBN Deployments; now therefore, be it


22 **RESOLVED**, that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'Trentai Unu Na*
23 *Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people
24 of Guam, commend and congratulate Master Chief Robert Joseph Reilly on the
25 occasion of his retirement from the U.S. Department of the Navy; and does further

1 extend a most sincere *Un Dangkolo Si Yu'os Ma'åse* to him for his thirty (30) years of
2 military service to the United States and Guam, and its people; and be it further

3 **RESOLVED**, that the Speaker and the Chairperson of the Committee on Rules
4 certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of
5 the same be thereafter transmitted to Master Chief Robert Reilly; to the United States
6 Department of the Navy; and to the Honorable Edward J.B. Calvo, *I Maga'lahren*
7 *Guåhan*.
