- degree in Clinical Psychology in 1983 and finished her doctorate degree in Clinical
- 2 Psychology in 1989; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Dr. Venditti's professional experience started in 1978 as a
- 4 research associate at the University of Pennsylvania School of Medicine and Obesity
- 5 Research Group in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania until 1980;
- WHEREAS, in 1985, she started her internship as Clinical Psychology in New
- 7 York University-Bellevue, Department of Psychiatry, New York, NY; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Dr. Venditti was the recruitment coordinator and interventionist
- 9 for EPICS Program of the University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine and Western
- 10 Psychiatric Institute and Clinic in Pittsburgh, PA from 1986 to 1991; and
- WHEREAS, in 1991, she became the project coordinator and interventionist
- 12 for Behavioral Weight Control Program, Family History of Diabetes Study,
- 13 University of Pittsburgh Medical Center, and Western Psychiatric Institute and Clinic
- in Pittsburgh, PA until 1995; and
- WHEREAS, she also maintained her private clinical practice from 1991 to
- 16 2006 with specialization on adolescent and adult psychotherapy in Pittsburgh, PA; and
- WHEREAS, her professional accomplishments include her appointments as
- 18 program coordinator of the Diabetes Prevention Program of the University of
- 19 Pittsburgh Medical Center, and Western Psychiatric Institute and Clinic (1995-1996);
- 20 coordinator, Lifestyle Resource Core, Diabetes Prevention Program, University of
- 21 Pittsburgh Medical Center and Western Psychiatric Institute and Clinic (1996 -2002);
- 22 Associate Director, Behavior Core, Obesity Nutrition and Research Center,
- 23 University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine, Pittsburgh, PA (2004-2009); and
- 24 WHEREAS, currently, she is an assistant professor of Psychiatry, Department
- of Behavioral Medicine, University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine, Pittsburgh, PA;

1 WHEREAS, Dr. Venditti's other experience and professional membership 2 includes American Psychological Association (APA); National Diabetes Education 3 Program (NDEP), American Diabetes Association (ADA), North American 4 Association for the Study of Obesity (NAASO) and Editorial Board of DOC News 5 from 2005 to 2008; and 6 WHEREAS, in addition to her academic and professional experience, Dr. 7 Venditti had also published works in various publications and journals that dealt with 8 diabetes disease and diabetes care; and 9 WHEREAS, she had considerable experience in designing, training and 10 evaluating interventions for the prevention and treatment of obesity and type 2 diabetes in adults and youth. Her most significant continuing role is being the 11 Director of the Lifestyle Resource Core for the Diabetes Prevention Program 12 Outcomes Study (DDPOS) in which she examines the role of treatment for eating and 13 physical activity behaviors as they related to a variety of metabolic, physiologic and 14 15 psychological/behavioral outcomes in diabetes and the metabolic syndrome; and 16 WHERAS, the information shared by Dr. Venditti with the people of Guam 17 will be very important in our continuing efforts to control diabetes on Guam; and 18 WHEREAS, Dr. Venditti's extensive body of academics and research experience in diabetes diseases will be very helpful to the community; and now, 19 20 therefore be it 21 **RESOLVED,** that the Committee on Rules of I Mina'Trentai Unu Na 22 Liheslaturan Guåhan does hereby, on behalf of I Liheslaturan Guåhan and the people 23 of Guam, recognize and commend Dr. Elizabeth M.
