3 **WHEREAS,** alcohol and drug abuse on Guam, and throughout the nation, have 4 reached epidemic proportions. As an island community, we value the health and safety of our citizens, especially Guam's youth. Today, we face many challenges as we try to
protect our loved ones from the ongoing battle against substance abuse; and

WHEREAS, substance abuse, either through the use of drugs or alcohol, not only has a negative effect on individuals, families, businesses and schools, but it is also a contributing factor in the three (3) leading causes of death among adolescents, which are accidents, homicides, and suicide; and

WHEREAS, the "Red Ribbon Campaign" began in 1985 after drug traffickers in Mexico City murdered Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) Agent Enrique "Kiki" Camarena. His friends and neighbors wore red badges of satin signifying his honor and to show that they would continue to fight against illegal drug activities. The mission of the Red Ribbon Campaign is to present a unified and visible commitment towards the creation of a DRUG-FREE AMERICA; and

WHEREAS, recognizing the seriousness of this threat, the National Family Partnership initiated the first (1st) "Red Ribbon Campaign" in 1986. This grassroots effort emphasized education and the importance of teaching children, teenagers, families, and communities about the dangers of drug and alcohol abuse. It is now the oldest and largest drug prevention program that reaches millions of youth, families and communities in every corner of the country; and since 1986, significant progress has been made in reducing drug and alcohol abuse among Guam's young adults; and

20 WHEREAS, the 2011 "Red Ribbon Campaign Week" theme is: "IT'S UP TO TOCONNECTION...CHOICES 21 ME BE DRUG-FREE...SEE THE CONSEQUENCES," and some of this year's activities include: a Poster Contest; a 22 Drug-Free Rap Contest; a School Gate Decorating Contest; Red Ribbon Waves in 23 Northern, Central and Southern Guam; a "Say Boo to Drugs" Community Event; and 24 Educational (School) outreach activities, as well as numerous print, TV, and radio 25 media events. These activities are made possible by the Red Ribbon Campaign 26

Committee, which is comprised of the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration; the U.S. 1 2 Probation Office of Guam and the Northern Mariana Islands; the Guam Bureau of 3 Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives; the Guam National Guard Counterdrug Program; Guam Joint Region Marianas; Marine Forces Pacific; the Navy Theaters: the 4 5 USS Frank Cable (AS-40); the U.S. Attorney's Office; the U.S. Department of Defense Educational Activities; the U.S. Marshals Service; the U.S. Naval Base Guam; the U.S. 6 Naval Hospital Guam; the Department of Corrections; the Department of Mental Health 7 & Substance Abuse; the Department of Youth Affairs; the Guam Department of 8 9 Education; the Guam Fire Department; the Guam Police Department; the Judiciary of Guam- Juvenile Drug Court; the Mayors Council of Guam; the Office of the Governor; 10 I Mina'Trentai Unu Na Liheslaturan Guåhan; Big Brothers Big Sisters of Guam; the 11 Guam Chamber of Commerce; the Firefighters Organization for Activities & Morale; 12 13 Island Girl Power; Sanctuary Incorporated; VARO- Victims Advocates Reaching Out; 14 WestCare - Pacific Islands; Youth for Youth LIVE!; Advance Management, Inc.; the Agana Shopping Center; the Guam Premier Outlets; Hollywood Theaters-Guam 15 16 Megaplex Cinemas; Island Time Magazine; KIJI FM 104.3; KUAM; the Marianas Variety; the Pacific Daily News; the Sorenson Media Group; and Tango, Inc. dba: 17 18 Micronesia Mall and Stadium Theaters. WHEREAS, it is the goal of the "Red Ribbon Campaign" to involve families, schools, businesses, churches, law enforcement agencies and service organizations to establish an atmosphere that supports awareness and education that will help to prevent illegal drug-related activities; and

WHEREAS, on the occasion of the 2011 "*Red Ribbon Campaign Week*" *I Mina'Trentai Unu Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* encourages all residents to consider how they can participate in this important effort, so that as we build upon the successes of the past we can strengthen the Guam of tomorrow, and with strong resolve and creative
leadership we can protect our community from the preventable dangers of alcohol,
tobacco and drug abuse; now therefore, be it
