Relative to recognizing, commending, and thanking the administrators, teachers, staff, students, and families of Lyndon B. Johnson Elementary School and *Tamuning* Elementary School on their focused and successful work.

## BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF *I*MINA'TRENTAL UNU NA LIHESLATURAN GUÂHAN:

- 3 WHEREAS, the Lyndon B. Johnson Elementary School (LBJES) Angels and
- 4 the Tamuning Elementary School (TAMES) Whales have continuously achieved
- 5 educational excellence under the leadership of Principal Kathy Reyes and Assistant
- 6 Principal Geraldine Quejada, and the dedicated and hard working faculty, staff and
- 7 involved families; and

WHEREAS, for the past three (3) years, LBJES students have shown an increase in scores for Reading, Language and Math on the Standard Achievement Test-10 (SAT-10), with students performing at Levels 3 (proficient) and 4 (advanced); during School Year 2009-2010, the SAT-10 district-wide rankings revealed that among twenty-six (26) elementary schools, LBJES placed in the top four (4) in all subject categories; in School Year 2010-2011, LBJES ranked first (1st) place for complete battery, first (1st) place in Math and Environment, and second (2nd) place in Reading and Language; and WHEREAS, students who score in the ninetieth (90<sup>th</sup>) to ninety-ninth (99<sup>th</sup>) percentile in academic areas are recognized by the SAT 10, in which TAMES scored in the top ten (10) complete battery in all grades for School Year 2010-2011; and TAMES also received the following awards for their performance during School Year

2010 to 2011: the National Award of Honor (1-2 academic areas); the National Distinguished Award (3-4 academic areas); and the National Award of Excellence (5

or more academic areas); and each year over a hundred students are awarded for this

exemplary accomplishment; and

WHEREAS, in 2008, Lyndon B. Johnson Elementary School received full accreditation by the Western Association of School and Colleges (WASC); and during a Mid-Term visit on March 2011, the WASC reaffirmed the six (6) year accreditation, which expires in June 2014; and also in 2008, *Tamuning* Elementary School was granted a three (3) year accreditation; and

WHEREAS, LBJ and *Tamuning* Elementary Schools' programs include the Department of Education Extended Day (DEED), English as a Second Language (ESL), *Chamorro*, Special Education, Summer School, Gifted and Talented (GATE), Rainbows, Character Education, and Youth Crime Watch; and specifically to LBJ are the Pre-K GATE, and Reading is the Key programs; and specifically to *Tamuning* 

- 1 Elementary are the Student Council, Peer Mediation, Pre-School Autism, and Pre-
- 2 School Medically Fragile programs; and
- 3 WHEREAS, through the Character Education program, LBJES and TAMES
- 4 concentrate, formally and informally, on stressing character qualities that maintain a
- 5 safe and orderly learning environment that will ultimately equip students to be model
- 6 citizens, and through this program the schools' student discipline rate was consistently
- 7 "Exceptional" throughout the school years; and
- 8 WHEREAS, LBJES, through the Families and Schools Together (FAST)
- 9 Workshops, presented strategies that families can use to involve themselves in their
- 10 child's educational journey. Parents that got involved and participated received a
- "Very Important Parent" (VIP) Award; and as fifty-five percent (55%) of LBJES
- parents attended workshops throughout the school year, sixty-six percent (66%) of the
- parents received the "VIP" Award; and
- 14 WHEREAS, TAMES, through the visits of the Success For All support team
- on a monthly basis and giving immediate feedback and trainings in the different areas
- of the program, saw that thirty percent (30%) of its students were on grade level at the
- end of School Year 2008-2009; thirty-nine percent (39%) were on grade level for
- 18 School Year 2009-2010; and forty-three percent (43%) were on grade level for School
- 19 Year 2010-2011; and
- WHEREAS, through the dedication and hard work of the families,
- 21 administrators, faculty and staff of LBJES and TAMES, various extra-curricular
- school activities were conducted, to include the Big Bird Read a Thon; the IRA Read
- A Thon; the Isla Art A Thon; Constitution Day; Rainbows for Children; the Science
- 24 Fair; the National "Teach Children to Save"; the School Spirit Days; the Cultural
- 25 Pride Parade; Family and Character Monthly Projects; Presentations by GPD, GFD,
- 26 UOG Nutrition, DPW, SWAT, Civil Defense, the Department of Agriculture, and

- 1 Public Health Alcohol and Tobacco Prevention; the Word and Math Manipulative of
- 2 the Month; Career Day; and Scoring High (SAT 10 Test Prep); and
- 3 WHEREAS, special extra-curricular activities at LBJES were the Christmas
- 4 Program; Read Across America; Jump Rope for the Heart; "I Am Lovable and
- 5 Capable"; the Portfolio Showcase; the Food Drive (Salvation Army); the Word and
- 6 Math Manipulative of the Month; and GATE Day at the Mall; and
- WHEREAS, special extra-curricular activities at TAMES were the 5K
- 8 Run/Walk; the Harvest Carnival; a Spelling Bee; the Japanese Student
- 9 Exchange/Visit; the Special Olympics; Valentine's Day; the Math Olympiad; the
- 10 Kangaroo Math; the UNICEF Drive; the United Nations Festival; Recycling; and the
- 11 Word of the Month; and
- WHEREAS, Lyndon B. Johnson and Tamuning Elementary Schools have
- 13 thriving Community Partnerships with the Korean School of Guam, Cost U Less,
- 14 Twinkles, Ironwood Estates, Payless Supermarkets, South Pacific Petroleum
- 15 Company, the Tamuning-Tumon-Harmon Mayor's Office, Paradise Fitness Center,
- Guam Premier Outlets, Garcia's Optical, AB Construction, and Ninja Restaurant; now
- 17 therefore, be it
- 18 **RESOLVED,** that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'Trentai Unu Na*
- 19 Liheslaturan Guåhan does hereby, on behalf of I Liheslaturan Guåhan and the people
- 20 of Guam, recognize, commend, and thank the administrators, faculty, staff and
- 21 families of Lyndon B. Johnson Elementary School and *Tamuning* Elementary School
- for their dedication to the education of our children; and be it further
