WHEREAS, on Saturday, November 26, 2011, the Japan Club of Guam and
 the Japanese community residing on Guam will celebrate the Thirty-Second (32nd)

Japan Autumn Festival at *Ypao* Beach Park, an annual event organized by the Japan
 Club of Guam; and

WHEREAS, the Festival was started to show appreciation to the Gods for a good harvest, and has its origin in the autumn festival, which is an event that is held every autumn because it is the season when rice grains, the Japanese food staple, ripens, and *sake* (rice wine) is also brewed from the rice; and

WHEREAS, the Japan Club Autumn Festival was first held in 1979 when the
Japan Club Directors considered to make the Japanese children who live here on
Guam become more aware of their Japanese customs and culture; and

WHEREAS, during the first Autumn Festival celebration, the Festival Stage
was handmade, and although the scale of the event was very small, the children who
participated in the event were very happy; and

WHEREAS, in 1992, Katsunori Usui and his wife, Rika Usui, both active members of the Japan Club of Guam, presented an "*omikoshi*" to the Japan Club of Guam. *Omikoshi* is a portable shrine, which is the main attraction at the Festival, and in Japan it is believed that the Gods dwell there; and

WHEREAS, the event has expanded and now has become a huge event in Guam. In recent years, more than thirty thousand (30,000) local residents and tourists alike have attended the autumn event to enjoy the Japanese and local entertainment, the food, and games for the children. Various cultural groups from Japan are invited to perform for the many attendees of the Festival; and

WHEREAS, the Japan Club of Guam considers the Japan Autumn Festival as an event that strengthens the relationship between the local residents and the Japanese community; and

WHEREAS, this year's Festival banner will read: "Arigato Guam, Thank You
 Tomodachi" to sincerely thank all the corporations, business establishments and

residents of Guam who generously donated their time and money to assist the people
 of Japan who were affected by a devastating earthquake and tsunami last March; and

WHEREAS, the Japan Club of Guam, a non-profit organization founded in 1972, consists of one hundred twenty-four (124) corporate members, two hundred thirty-five (235) private members, and twenty-five (25) associate members. As of May 2011, the Japan Club of Guam has a membership total of one thousand eleven (1,011) members; and
