Relative to commending and recognizing the West Care Pacific Islands organization, the Guam HIV/AIDS Network (GUAHAN) Project, and the Guam Alternative Lifestyle Association (GALA) on the occasion of the Annual Torchlight Ceremony in honor of World AIDS Day on December 1, 2011.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I

- 3 WHEREAS, World AIDS Day is held on the 1st of December every year, and
- 4 it is an opportunity for people worldwide to unite in the fight against HIV, to show

- their support for people living with HIV, and to commemorate those people who have
- 2 died from the disease; and
- 3 WHEREAS, World AIDS Day was the first ever global health day, and the
- 4 first one was held in 1988; and
- 5 **WHEREAS,** the global theme of this year's World AIDS Day ceremony is:
- 6 "Getting to Zero: Zero AIDS-Related Deaths. Zero Discrimination. Zero New
- 7 Infections." This year's commemoration is particularly significant because it marks
- 8 thirty (30) years since the first case of HIV/AIDS was confirmed; and
- 9 WHEREAS, there has been about two hundred twenty-five (225) HIV cases
- diagnosed on Guam since 1985, and fifty (50) people are currently living with HIV on
- Guam. Globally, an estimated 33.3 million people have HIV. From 1981 to 2009,
- more than twenty-five million (25,000,000) people have died from the virus, making it
- one of the most destructive pandemics in history; and
- 14 WHEREAS, many scientific advances have been made in HIV treatment, and
- there are now laws to protect people living with HIV. But despite this, people do not
- 16 know the facts about how to protect themselves and others from HIV, and stigma and
- discrimination remain a reality for many people living with HIV; and
- 18 WHEREAS, World AIDS Day is an important occasion, as it reminds the
- 19 public and the government that HIV has not gone away- and that there is still a vital
- 20 need to raise money, to increase awareness, to fight prejudice, and to improve
- 21 HIV/AIDS education; and
- WHEREAS, as part of Guam's and the international community's efforts to
- observe December 1 as World AIDS Day, West Care Pacific Islands, under the Guam
- 24 HIV/AIDS Network Project, with the help of Guam's Alternative Lifestyle

- 1 Association (GALA), will be lighting torches at 6:00 p.m. at the historic Lujan House
- 2 in Hagåtña;
- 3 **WHEREAS**, the West Care Pacific Islands belong to the West Care nationwide
- 4 family of tax-exempt organizations that provide a wide spectrum of health and human
- 5 services in both residential and outpatient environments to more than thirty thousand
- 6 (30,000) youth, adults and families annually; and
- 7 WHEREAS, under the care of Ms. Kate Baltazar, West Care Pacific Islands
- 8 also provides services, such as substance abuse and addiction treatment, homeless and
- 9 runaway shelters, domestic violence treatment and prevention, and mental health
- 10 programs; and
- WHEREAS, West Care also provides prevention education and supportive
- group counseling for girls ages twelve (12) to seventeen (17) years old, through a
- program called *Project Isa-ta*; and
- WHEREAS, *Project Isa-ta* aims to reduce the risk of contracting HIV/AIDS
- and STDs among our young girls, as well as to increase self-esteem and positive body
- image, and to educate them on abuse and violence; now therefore, be it
- 17 **RESOLVED**, that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'Trentai Unu Na*
- 18 Liheslaturan Guåhan does hereby, on behalf of I Liheslaturan Guåhan and the people
- 19 of Guam, commend and recognize the West Care Pacific Islands organization, the
- 20 Guam HIV/AIDS Network (GUAHAN) Project, and Guam's Alternative Lifestyle
- 21 Association (GALA) on the occasion of the Annual Torchlight Ceremony in honor of
- World AIDS Day on December 1, 2011, at the historic Lujan House in *Hagåtña*; and
