## BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA'TRENTAL UNU NA LIHESLATURAN GUÂHAN:

WHEREAS, Mr. Romeo "Sam" Hernandez Sangueza dedicated himself to the protection of the United States of America, serving as a Sailor in the U.S. Navy for twenty-eight (28) years, from 1959 to 1987; and upon his retirement from the U.S.

- 6 military, serving for another eleven (11) years as a U.S. Immigration Officer with the
- 7 United States Immigration, Guam Office, from 1989 to 2000; totaling thirty-nine (39)
- 8 years of honorable Federal service; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Sangueza was born on February 18, 1937; and is the son of Mr. Damaso Verde Sangueza and Mrs. Remedios Hernandez Sangueza of San Pablo,

3 Nueva Ecija, Philippines; Mr. Sangueza is the eldest child of five (5) children, and his

4 siblings are Mrs. Cora Sangueza Ramirez, Mr. Nestor H. Sangueza, Mrs. Lolita

5 Sangueza Carman, and Mr. Nario H. Sangueza; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Sangueza attended Nueva Ecija High School and graduated in 1954; and five (5) years later, in 1959, he enlisted in the U.S. Navy from the Philippines, after his mother was informed that the U.S. military was recruiting Filipino workers, and she had encouraged her son to enlist; and

WHEREAS, at that time, non-U.S. citizen military members were relegated to employment assignments such as mess hall attendants; and while Mr. Sangueza began his military career serving as a cook, he later studied to become an Ocean Systems Technician; and he would serve as an Ocean Systems Technician Chief for the rest of his commission; and

**WHEREAS**, after serving for six (6) years in the U.S. Navy, Mr. Sangueza met Ms. Corazon Ramirez, a teacher, through a mutual friend; –and they fell in love and eventually married in a church in the Philippines in January 1965; and

WHEREAS, during his nearly three (3) decades of military service, Mr. Sangueza traveled the world and was assigned to various duty stations, including: at the Charleston Naval Station in South Carolina, from December 1959 to July 1960; on the USS *Proteus* in Scotland, from July 1960 to August 1961; on the USS *Perch* in the Philippines, from November 1961 to August 1965; on the USS *Segundo* in California, from September 1965 to February 1967; at the Commander Submarine Division in San Diego, California, from March 1967 to May 1968; at the Naval Weapons Station in Virginia, from June 1968 to July 1970; on the USS *Tullibee* in Connecticut, from December 1970 to March 1973; at Naval Facility in Lewes, Delaware, from July 1973

to July 1976; at Naval Facility, Guam, from September 1976 to September 1980; at

2 Patrol Squadron Wing ONE Detachment, Guam, from September 1980 to September

1984; and at the Naval Ocean Processing Facility in Hawaii, from November 1984 to

4 December 1987, where Mr. Sangueza retired as a U.S. Navy Chief Petty Officer; and

WHEREAS, in 1976, after an assignment in Delaware, Mr. Sangueza was transferred to Guam, where he and Mrs. Sangueza would live and raise their children for the next eight (8) years, from 1976 to 1984; and they had bought a home in Marianas Terrace, *Yigo*, in 1980 (where they continue to reside), before being transferred to his last duty station in Hawaii, where he retired from U.S. military service in 1987; and

WHEREAS, after Mr. Sangueza retired, the Sanguezas returned home to Guam, where they raised their children; and Mrs. Sangueza continued to serve as a teacher in Guam's public schools, and Mr. Sangueza served as a U.S. Immigration Officer with the United States Immigration, Guam Office, because of the close proximity to their native Philippines; and

WHEREAS, Mr. and Mrs. Sangueza would raise a young family throughout the duration of Mr. Sangueza's military career; and are the proud parents of Juancho Rey Ramirez Sangueza, an engineer; Cheryl Ramirez Sangueza, PhD; Cora Sangueza Brown, RN; and Charlyn Sangueza Haun, an administrator/CEO; and they are also the proud grandparents of Jasmine Renee Sangueza Brown, 20, a junior at the University of Texas, Arlington; Zena Rae Sangueza Brown, 16, a high school junior in San Antonio, Texas; and James Romeo Sangueza, born on June 1, 2011; and

WHEREAS, throughout their lives, Mr. Sangueza instilled in his children values, ethics and the practice of hard work, humility, and the importance of a smile and a great sense of humor,— and that ultimately it would lead to a life of success and happiness; and Mr. Sangueza never fathomed "calling in sick" or leaving a job before

its completion, and he had always given his best effort, and never viewed working as an optional endeavor; and he continues to ensure that his adult children remain humble regardless of status or educational accomplishments; his family continues to gather for weekly dinners; and they continue to be a presence during their children's and grandchildren's life events, including births, christenings, graduations and weddings, and the family continues to celebrate holidays together, appreciating and enjoying the gift of togetherness; and Mr. Sangueza, without avail, continually greets people with his genuine smile filled with a warmth that connects him with all those he encounters; now therefore, be it
