- 3 **WHEREAS,** *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*, through the adoption of Resolution No.
- 4 308-31 (LS), recognized and commended the Association of Government Accountants
- 5 (AGA) for its contributions in the field of accounting across our country and our

- 1 island; including the recognition of the AGA Citizen-Centric Government Reporting
- 2 Initiative, which was launched a few years ago with the intent to foster an innovative
- 3 means of communication between governments and their citizenry; and
- 4 WHEREAS, University of Guam (UOG) Professor, Dr. Doreen Crisostomo,
- 5 first introduced her students to the Citizen-Centric Government Reporting Initiative in
- 6 her Spring 2009 BA401 "Government Accounting" class. Dr. Crisostomo
- 7 incorporated the initiative into her syllabus to complement classroom learning and
- 8 give her students exposure to real-world experiences through interacting with our
- 9 local government agencies to compile various citizen-centric reports (CCR) for each
- 10 agency involved; and
- 11 WHEREAS, on October 20, 2011, the AGA National kicked-off their Fifth
- 12 (5<sup>th</sup>) Annual Government Finance Case Challenge, inviting the best undergraduate
- 13 accounting/financial management/business students in the country to compete.
- 14 Student teams were to collaboratively analyze and offer a written response to a case
- centered creating a U.S. city government CCR; and
- WHEREAS, UOG Accounting Professor Dr. Doreen Crisostomo formed a four
- 17 (4) member student team from her Fall 2011 BA401 "Government Accounting" class.
- 18 Under the guidance of Dr. Crisostomo, the team of Ms. Ruren G. Clemente, Ms.
- 19 Amber K. Castro, Mr. Edward E. Brobesong, and Mr. Garry K. Yeoh entered into the
- 20 AGA National's competition to prepare a citizen-centric report for the city of
- 21 Alexandria, Virginia, to include a paper that summarizes the criteria and the
- 22 justification the team used to decide what information to include and exclude in the
- 23 performance report; and
- WHEREAS, the UOG team of Clemente, Castro, Brobesong, and Yeoh,
- successfully placed as one (1) of the top three (3) finalist teams, along with Old
- 26 Dominion University, and the University of North Carolina at Pembroke; and

1	WHEREAS, all finalist teams were awarded scholarships to attend the AGA's
2	Tenth (10 <sup>th</sup> ) Annual National Leadership Conference in Washington, D.C., which the
3	UOG team accepted; and
4	WHEREAS, I Liheslaturan Guåhan, through the adoption of Resolution No.
5	308-31 (LS), recognized, commended, and offered its best wishes to the UOG team,
6	which attended the Conference from February 16-17, 2012; and
7	WHEREAS, all three (3) finalist teams presented their finalized solutions on
8	February 16, 2012 before a panel of judges, and conference attendees, comprised of
9	federal, state and local government leaders; corporate partners; and chief financial
10	officers; and
11	WHEREAS, on February 17, 2012, the judges' selection was announced, and
12	the UOG team was selected as this year's Case Challenge winners; and in addition to
13	the honor and recognition of holding the position as this year's winning team, each
14	member of the team will also receive a cash prize and a free one (1) year AGA
15	membership; and
16	WHEREAS, the AGA followed through on its promise that this experience
17	would challenge students' moral reasoning, raise their awareness of the importance of
18	government accountability, and open doors to a future career in government; and
19	WHEREAS, the advisor and students of the UOG team followed through on
20	their promise to work their hardest and try their best, for themselves, for our university
21	and for our island; now therefore, be it
