Relative to recognizing the contributions made to Guam and our people by Drs. Robert and Ruby Stahlnecker; to acknowledge their humanitarian acts for other Pacific Islands, Nations and people over the past forty three (43) years, and expressing the best wishes of the people of Guam on the occasion of their Retirement.

1BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I2MINA'TRENTAI UNU NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, Dr. Robert Eugene Stahlnecker grew up in Beloit, Wisconsin,
attending high school at Bethel Academy, and played saxophone in his school band;
future spouse Ruby Kahler was raised in College Place, Washington, working as a

teenage office nurse for her doctor father, gaining much valuable medical knowledge
 under his tutelage; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Stahlnecker was sent to China during World War II, to work behind enemy lines with Chinese guerillas and the U.S. Navy, and following the war, attended Walla Walla University (WWU) in Washington State, where he met his future bride, Ruby, who took nursing courses at Loma Linda University, but before completing the last year of the program they were married and moved to New Mexico, where they taught school, Dr. Stahlnecker also serving as a Pastor; and

9 WHEREAS, in 1953, they traveled to India, working at several schools where 10 Dr. Stahlnecker was Principal, while Ruby taught classes, helped with school 11 administration, served as a nurse, and helped deliver babies when needed, and Dr. 12 Stahlnecker would start a school band, teaching his students to play various 13 instruments, while Ruby taught piano lessons; and

WHEREAS, they returned to New Mexico in 1958, and Dr. Stahlnecker resumed his education while working as a Pastor; after receiving his Masters, they returned to India in 1960, Dr. Stahlnecker once again a Principal, and Ruby working as an administrator, teacher and nurse, all while raising five (5) children and delivering babies, but returned home after a year, due to the illness of one (1) of their children; and

WHEREAS, settling in Eugene, Oregon, Ruby taught fifth (5th) and sixth (6th) grades while Dr. Stahlnecker worked on and received his Doctorate; the family then returned to WWU where Dr. Stahlnecker taught Education, and Ruby received her Bachelor's and Master's Degrees while working full time as a Special Education teacher and mother to their five (5) children; and

WHEREAS, the Stahlneckers learned about Guam from Elizabeth and Edna
 Flores, who were also students at WWU, and decided they would move to Guam in

1969 with three (3) of their children, Dr. Stahlnecker, teaching at the University of
 Guam from 1969-1973 as a member of the Education Department, while Ruby
 developed and ran the Curriculum Resource Center, and also taught in the Education
 Department, from 1969 to 1977; and

5 WHEREAS, when the Vietnam war ended in 1975, Ruby (through the 6 Adventist Community Center) coordinated volunteers to help with refugee efforts. the 7 Red Cross placed the Adventists to assist and be in charge of distributing the clothes 8 provided by the Red Cross, and offered conversational English classes for refugees, 9 among other activities; and

WHEREAS, in May 1976, Super Typhoon Pamela devastated Guam, leaving communications with off-island non-existent, so then-Governor Ricky Bordallo, had Dr. Stahlnecker's son Leslie, who worked with Civil Defense, ask his father to use his ham radio to ask the Adventist Disaster and Relief Association (ADRA) for assistance; Dr. Stahlnecker's radio message was the first post-typhoon message to get through; and

WHEREAS, the radio message resulted in the ADRA shipping seventeen and a half (17-1/2) tons of assistance and emergency supplies by plane to Guam, and Guam's Adventist Community Service helped with the distribution of clothing, provided warehouse space, and unloaded and delivered supplies; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Stahlnecker has remained active over the years with the Ham Radio Club, just as Ruby has remained a faithful supporter of the Adventist Community Service, and the Stahlneckers were very active with the Guam Adventist Academy (GAA), teaching Bible classes and band, giving music lessons to students, assisting High School students through community outreach, working on the school's curriculum organization and serving as GAA Board Members for many years; and

1	WHEREAS, after eight (8) years in Guam, the Stahlneckers moved to Sri
2	Lanka to run Lahpahana Adventist Seminary, then returned to California due to
3	Ruby's ill health, Robert pastoring and building a new church in Southern California,
4	while Ruby completed her Ph.D., in Education from nearby La Sierra University; and
5	WHEREAS, the Stahlneckers returned to Guam in 1986, Ruby working at Upi
6	Elementary School, teaching at the University of Guam (UOG) for five (5) years, and
7	then both Stahlneckers teaching in Yap, Kosrae and the Marshall Islands for UOG's
8	Center for Continuing Education and Outreach Programs. "Grandma" Ruby
9	eventually retiring from the government of Guam in 1991; and
10	WHEREAS, Dr. Stahlnecker administered the UOG extension program in
11	Saipan from 1990-1993, taught classes and supervised student teachers, with Ruby
12	joining him from 1991-1993 to research and teach for the Northern Marianas College,
13	enabling NMC to receive an important grant; and
14	WHEREAS the Stahlneckers returned to Guam in 1993, landing several hours
15	after the 8.2 Earthquake; traveled to China in 1995 to teach Conversational English;
16	returned to Guam for Robert to continue his work as a Lay Pastor, and pushed for and
17	coordinated NET Bible Outreach meetings for four (4) years beginning with NET 96,
18	while Ruby worked for the Governor's Commission for Educator Certification; and
19	WHEREAS, Ruby has remained active by making sure Sabbath Bible School
20	lessons, magazines and materials are ordered and received into the hands and hearts of
21	the members of the Man Aguaiya Fellowship Company of Seventh-day Adventists
22	alongside "Pastor Bob," the volunteer Lay Pastor who provides spiritual leadership by
23	example through the love and gentleness of Christ, and has been faithful in visiting
24	many homebound and bed-ridden members who have been tremendously blessed and
25	appreciative of this blessed from above ministry, now, therefore, be it

1 **RESOLVED,** that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'Trentai Unu Na* 2 *Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people 3 of Guam, does hereby recognize the contributions made to Guam and our people by 4 Drs. Robert and Ruby Stahlnecker; and does also acknowledge their humanitarian acts 5 for other Pacific islands, nations and people over the past forty three (43) years, and 6 expresses the best wishes of the people of Guam on the occasion of their retirement; 7 and be it further

8 **RESOLVED**, that the Speaker and the Chairperson of the Committee on Rules 9 certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of 10 the same be thereafter transmitted to Drs. Robert and Ruby Stahlnecker; and to the 11 Honorable Edward J.B. Calvo, *I Maga'lahen Guåhan*.
