Relative to requesting that the Honorable Madeleine Z. Bordallo, Guam Delegate to the United States Congress, secure authorization and funding for a United States Department of Labor (USDOL) Job Corps Center on Guam.

BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'TRENTAI UNU NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Labor's "Job Corps" is a nocost, educational and vocational training program that helps young people (ages 16 through 24) improve the quality of their lives through vocational and academic

training, by providing them with a safe, drug-free environment where they can take
advantage of the resources provided to gain skills that can be used to secure
meaningful employment; and

WHEREAS, beginning in 1964, and for nearly fifty (50) years, the Job Corps has been training young adults for meaningful careers, and is currently operating one hundred twenty-five (125) Job Corps Centers in every state, the District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico; *however*, there is no Job Corps Center on Guam; and

9 WHEREAS, Job Corps Centers employ holistic career development training 10 approaches that integrate the teaching of academic and vocational employability 11 skills with social competencies through a variety of both classroom and practical 12 learning experiences, that help to prepare young people for stable, long-term, high-13 paying jobs; and

WHEREAS, the Job Corps program provides individualized instruction to meet the needs of each student, utilizing standard eligibility criteria, while focusing on the core competencies of each individual student in academic, vocational, information technology, employability and independent living skills; and

WHEREAS, given the high rate of unemployment on Guam, our island is an ideal location for the services of a Job Corps Center, to provide young persons with the guidance and training necessary to secure meaningful, long-term employment; and

WHEREAS, the median age of Guam's population is considerably lower than that of the fifty (50) states, with Guam's males an average of 6.6 years younger, and Guam's females 8.4 years younger than their respective Mainland counterparts, which suggests that a larger percentage of young people on Guam

could benefit from the Jobs Corps program than could benefit in the rest of the
 country; and

WHEREAS, unfortunately for the youth of Guam, the nearest Job Corps Center is in Hawaii, some three thousand eight hundred (3,800) miles away, and not easily accessible to potential candidates from Guam who could benefit from the services that would be provided if there were a Job Corps Center established on Guam; now therefore, be it
