Relative to commending and congratulating the Salvation Army Guam Corps as it celebrates twenty (20) years of dedicated service to the people of Guam.

BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'TRENTAI UNU NA LIHESLATURAN

GUÂHAN:

WHEREAS, the Salvation Army, founded in 1865, is a religious and charitable organization providing help and hope to thousands of people around the world; and

WHEREAS, in the last twenty (20) years, the Salvation Army Guam Corps has built a network of programs to provide services to those who are most in need of help; and

1	WHEREAS, Lieutenants Ted and Debby Horwood first brought the Salvation
2	Army organization to Guam in 1992, just before Typhoon Omar had passed over
3	Guam; and
4	WHEREAS, in July 1995, Captains Dave and Linda Harmon arrived as the
5	new Corps Officers for the Salvation Army Guam Corps; and
6	WHEREAS, from June 2006 to June 2007, Majors Brian and Leticia Saunders
7	served as Corps Officers, followed by Captains Thomas and Christina Taylor, who
8	currently serve as Corps Officers of the Salvation Army Guam Corps; and
9	WHEREAS, the Lighthouse Recovery Center, a sixteen (16)-bed residence,
10	opened in 1998, and has since grown to expand its program in April 14, 2009, to serve
11	more men with substance abuse issues by moving into a state of the art facility,
12	increasing their bed capacity to thirty (30); and
13	WHEREAS, the Salvation Army Guam Corps oversees the Lighthouse
14	Recovery Center's annual Community Thanksgiving Feast serving over one thousand
15	on hundred (1,100) persons in need; and
16	WHEREAS, the Salvation Army was recently awarded funds from the
17	Department of Housing & Urban Development's Continuum of Care Homeless
18	Assistance Grants to operate a four (4) bedroom group home for dual diagnosed
19	homeless clients who graduated from the Lighthouse Recovery Center's six (6) month
20	program; and
21	WHEREAS, other Salvation Army programs include youth activities, after
22	school activities, day camp, summer camp, and Youth Councils established both in
23	Guam and Chuuk, whereby a five (5)-day Salvation Army International Youth
24	Conference was held in 2005; and

WHEREAS, in addition to the many services they provide, the Salvation Army 1 2 Guam Corps operates the Family Services Center, which provides emergency 3 assistance to families in need of food, clothing, rent, or utilities; and 4 WHEREAS, the Family Services Center also provides food boxes to over one 5 thousand four hundred (1,400) persons, toys to over one thousand five hundred (1,500) children during the Christmas season, and participates in the Guam Homeless 6 7 Coalition's annual island-wide Homeless Count and Passport to Services; and 8 WHEREAS, the Guam Corps operates the Salvation Army Thrift Store, which has gone from a small store in Harmon to its present two (2)-story, three thousand five 9 hundred (3,500) square foot location in Tamuning, offering low-cost clothing, 10 11 furniture, and a variety of other household goods to the community; and 12 WHEREAS, since their establishment on Guam, the Salvation Army Guam 13 Corps has partnered with other community organizations and businesses which enrich 14 life on Guam, such as the Guam Symphony Society, the Guam Territorial Band, the 15 Rotary Club of *Tumon* Bay, the Guam Women's Club, the Guam Council of Women's 16 Club, the Soroptimist International of Guam, the Guam Naval Officers' Spouse Connection, the Andersen Officers Spouses Club, the Chinese Ladies Association, the 17 18 Korean Women's Association of Guam, KUAM Care Force, the Chinese Chamber of 19 Commerce Guam, the Marine Corps Toys for Tots, the Guam Homeless Coalition and 20 the Council on Homelessness, the Bank of Hawaii, Citibank, First Hawaiian Bank, 21 and Wells Fargo Financial; and 22 WHEREAS, in addition to its regular offerings, the Salvation Army also 23 coordinates with local and federal authorities to offer help during typhoons and other disasters through its Emergency Disaster Services Team; and 24 WHEREAS, the Salvation Army Guam Corps has participated in numerous 25

disaster and relief efforts, including after the Korean Airlines crash, Supertyphoon
