WHEREAS, a ruby is also a deep red gemstone associated with wisdom, 1 importance, vitality, strength, vivacity, power and love: all words embodying the 2 strong and compassionate women who are Ruby Award recipients; and 3 WHEREAS, Ruby Award recipients are ordinary women who have worked 4 in extraordinary ways to benefit women and girls, and the work of the Honorees 5 helps to promote the issues that are important to the Soroptimist organization; and 6 WHEREAS, the program enables our local Soroptimist clubs, Soroptimist 7 International of Guam and Soroptimist International of the Marianas, as well as the 8 entire Soroptimist organization, to thank these women and encourage others to 9 explore ways to assist women and girls; and 10 WHEREAS, past Ruby Award recipients have included domestic violence 11 expert and advocate Elaine Weiss; former U.S. Congresswomen Patsy Mink and 12 Patricia Schroeder; novelist and former district attorney Linda Fairstein; Princess 13 Diana; former child actor and U.S. Ambassador Shirley Temple Black; former 14 Philippines President Corazon Aquino; and marine biologist Dr. Sylvia Earle; and 15 WHEREAS, Alicia Anne Garrido Limtiaco serves as the U.S. Attorney for 16 17

WHEREAS, Alicia Anne Garrido Limtiaco serves as the U.S. Attorney for the Districts of Guam and the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI). She was nominated to serve as U.S. Attorney by President Barack Obama in February 2010, and was confirmed by the U.S. Senate in April 2010; and

WHEREAS, U.S. Attorney Limtiaco is the first woman to serve as U.S. Attorney for the Districts of Guam and the CNMI, and is a member of the Attorney General's Advisory Committee (AGAC) Subcommittees/Working Groups, including Civil Rights, Cyber/Intellectual Property, Terrorism/National Security, Child Exploitation and Obscenity, and Controlled Substances and Asset Forfeiture; and

WHEREAS, in 2006, U.S. Attorney Limitaco was the first woman elected to serve as Attorney General of Guam, and served as Co-chair of the NAAG

- 1 Criminal Law Committee, the NAAG Youth Access to Alcohol Committee, and
- 2 Second Vice Chair of the CWAG Executive Team; and
- 3 WHEREAS, U.S. Attorney Limitaco spearheaded certain initiatives,
- 4 including the formation of task forces to address public school system health and
- safety; internet crimes against children, including sexual exploitation and child
- 6 pornography; cybersecurity and cybercrime, including identity theft; gambling and
- 7 gaming; human trafficking; and the implementation and compliance of Sex
- 8 Offender Registration and Notification Act (SORNA) requirements by the
- 9 government of Guam; and
- 10 WHEREAS, U.S. Attorney Limitaco served as the Chair of the Family
- Violence and Sexual Assault Task Force for the Executive Branch, and she was an
- active member of the Sexual Assault Response Team (SART) Steering Committee;
- 13 and
- 14 WHEREAS, prior to her tenure as Attorney General of Guam, U.S.
- 15 Attorney Limtiaco served as acting Chief Prosecutor, and as an Assistant Attorney
- General for the Office of the Attorney General, where she was the Lead Prosecutor
- of the Criminal Sexual Conduct and Family Violence Unit, and Co-chair of the
- 18 Governor's Family Violence Task Force; and
- 19 WHEREAS, U.S. Attorney Limitaco initiated the drafting and
- 20 implementation of the family violence protocol utilized by the Prosecution
- Division and the Guam Police Department; and she had assisted in the drafting of
- 22 the Guam Family Violence Acts, and the sex offender registration and notification
- 23 law; and
- WHEREAS, U.S. Attorney Limtiaco has over eight (8) years of private
- 25 practice experience; and also served as the Ninth Circuit Lawyer Representative
- for the District of Guam, as Judicial Extern with the U.S. District Court for the

- 1 Central District of California, and as a Law Clerk for the Superior Court of Guam;

- 3 WHEREAS, U.S. Attorney Limitaco served as Adjunct Faculty and
- 4 Assistant Professor with the University of Guam, and as Adjunct Faculty at the
- 5 Guam Community College; and
- 6 WHEREAS, U.S. Attorney Limitaco is married to Vincent Munoz, and they
- 7 have a daughter, Julia Faye, who is a sophomore in high school; and
- 8 WHEREAS, U.S. Attorney Limitaco joins other Ruby Award recipients
- 9 who have also identified and focused on a need in their communities, which has
- significantly contributed to the improvement of women's and girls' lives; now
