Relative to recognizing Mr. Jackson Leibsle Baker as an Air Cargo Pioneer in both Guam and the Philippines, and in congratulating his family and the staff of J. L. Baker and Sons for their economic contribution to the growth and development of Guam through forty (40) years of delivering faithful, dedicated and continuous transportation services to the people of Guam.

BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'TRENTAI UNU NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

3 WHEREAS, Mr. Jackson Leibsle Baker was born in Torrence, California. During 4 the World War II he served in the United States Coast Guard where he was later 5 deployed to the Philippines. After the Liberation of Guam and the end of World War II, Mr. Baker left California to relocate to the Philippines, and met and married Miss
 Narcisa Salvatierra of Jaro, Leyte, in 1947; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Baker worked to help build Clark Air Force Base for the US, and
in October 1950 founded the very first Air Cargo Company in the Philippines - LBC
Air Cargo Inc. (now known as LBC Express Inc.). LBC Air Cargo subsequently
became one of the largest air cargo companies in the Philippines, branching out to
multiple locations in the Archipelago; and

8 WHEREAS, in 1968 Mr. Baker opened the Air Express International (AEI) 9 branch office in Manila, now a major air cargo forwarder in the Philippines; and

WHEREAS, in 1969 Mr. Baker came to Guam to open up the first Air Cargo
company in Guam, namely Island Air Express Inc.; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Baker showed foresight in recognizing the potential of the shipping freight handling industry and the significant impact it has on the growth of Guam businesses, when in January 1972 he founded J. L. Baker & Sons with seed capital of \$300 and one pick-up truck, and invited his twin sons Lynn and Glenn to join the business; and

WHEREAS, J. L. Baker & Sons' first project in Guam was the packing and transportation of household goods by air for military personnel in transit during the Vietnam War, and the company was later designated the Guam agent for Vanpac Carrier; and in the 1980's, J. L. Baker and Sons was awarded the contract by GSA to move all of the offices of the federal government into a single location in the PDN Building (now the DNA building) in *Hagatña*; and

WHEREAS, over the years, J. L. Baker and Sons has been Guam's leading transportation and logistics services companies, transporting the majority of the construction materials for most of the hotels in *Tumon*, as well as the Micronesian Mall, Gibson Mall (now GPO), and other major projects; and WHEREAS, J. L. Baker and Sons has been Guam's agent for many successful
 freight companies, including United Parcel Service (now UPS), Dependable Hawaiian
 Express (now DHX), SKYPAK (now TNT), and others; and

WHEREAS, in 1985, Mr. Jackson Leibsle Baker, the founder of J. L. Baker and
Sons, passed away and the business was carried on by his wife, Mrs. Narcisa Baker,
and their two sons, Lynn and Glenn; and

WHEREAS, in 1998, Mrs. Narcisa Baker, wife of the founder of J. L. Baker and
Sons, passed away, and the business was incorporated as Baker International Inc.,
doing business as (DBA) J. L. Baker and Sons; and

WHEREAS, J. L. Baker and Sons is an International Air Transport Association (IATA) Cargo Network Services (CNS) endorsed agent offering secure, integrated transportation services; and in 2012 J. L. Baker and Sons celebrated twenty (20) years of faithful and continuous service to UPS, now one of the largest freight handling companies in the world, as its Guam agent; and

WHEREAS, J. L. Baker and Sons is now the Guam agent for LBC Express Inc. of
the Philippines, the company Mr. Jackson Leibsle Baker originally founded in 1950;
now therefore be it;

RESOLVED, that *I Liheslaturan Guahån* acknowledges and recognizes Mr.
 Jackson Leibsle Baker as an air cargo pioneer in both Guam and the Philippines; and
 be it further

RESOLVED, *I Liheslaturan Guahån* congratulates his family and the staff of J. L.
 Baker and Sons for faithfully and continuously providing transportation services to the
 people of Guam for forty (40) years; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Speaker and the Chairperson of the Committee on Rules certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to the Guam Chamber of Commerce; to Mr. Lynn
