3 **WHEREAS,** Captain Ignas Susuico was born on March 17, 1958, in Honolulu,

4 Hawaii; and

1 **WHEREAS,** Captain Susuico married the former Angie Mendiola, and
2 together have a daughter, Sangi; and

3 **WHEREAS,** Captain Susuico received a Bachelor of Science degree in
4 Criminal Justice, and was a distinguished military graduate. He was commissioned as
5 a Second (2nd) Lieutenant of the United States Army, after graduating from the
6 University of Guam in 1985; and

7 **WHEREAS,** Captain Susuico's education includes the Anti-Armored TOW
8 School, Primary Non-Commissioned Officers Course, NBC Officer Course, Supply
9 Officer Course, Hazardous Cargo, PLL, TAMMS, Infantry Basic and Advanced
10 Course, Airborne, Ranger, and Combined Arms and Service Staff School; and

11 **WHEREAS,** from 1986 to 1989, Captain Susuico was assigned to the Fourth
12 (4th) Battalion, Twenty-Third (23rd) Infantry Regiment (Motorized) at Fort Lewis,
13 Washington, where he served as Platoon Leader, Scout Platoon Leader, and Support
14 Platoon and Dining Facility Officer; and

15 **WHEREAS,** after completing the Infantry Officer Advanced Course, Captain
16 Susuico was assigned to Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, where he served as an Assistant
17 S-3, Third (3rd) Brigade, Twenty-Fifth (25th) Infantry (Light), from October 1990 to
18 May 1992; and

19 **WHEREAS,** after this command, Captain Susuico was an Operations Officer,
20 from August 1992 to July 1993, and was assigned to the United States Army Central
21 Command, ARCENT Training and Security-Kuwait; and

1 **WHEREAS**, in September 1993, Captain Susuico returned to Guam and
2 became an Assistant Professor of Military Science at the University of Guam Army
3 Senior ROTC (also known as the Triton Warrior Battalion), and instructed military
4 courses for MSI, MSII, MSIII cadets; and

5 **WHEREAS**, Captain Susuico had received numerous awards and decorations,
6 which include: the Meritorious Service Award; the Army Commendation Medal with
7 One (1) Oak Leaf Cluster; the Army Good Conduct Medal; the National Defense
8 Medal with one (1) Oak Leaf Cluster; the Southwest Asia Soldiers Medal with two (2)
9 Bronze Stars; the Humanitarian Service Ribbon; the Overseas Service Ribbon; the
10 Multinational Force and Observes Medal; the Saudi Arabia Medal; the Kuwait
11 Liberation Medal; the Parachutist Badge; the Ranger Tab; and the Expert Infantryman
12 Badge; and

13 **WHEREAS**, Captain Susuico retired from the United States Army in October
14 of 1996, and he was then hired by the Guam Department of Education in December of
15 the same year, assuming the position of Senior Army Instructor for the Simon
16 Sanchez High School JROTC Program; and


17 **WHEREAS**, Captain Susuico has touched numerous cadets' lives through his
18 leadership, teaching and continued support; and of their several notable
19 accomplishments, one of the highlights is at the annual Golden Bear West Coast
20 National Drill Competition, in which throughout the years, Guam's young high school
21 cadets have won several awards and have consistently placed as champions, bringing

1 pride to the JROTC programs of our island's schools, and to the people of Guam; now
