Relative to recognizing and congratulating Dr. Josephine Cenzon Caluag on the occasion of her retirement from the Department of Education; to commending her for a lifetime of distinguished service as an academic, consummate professional, volunteer, and businesswoman; and to further extending *Un Dångkolo Na Si Yu'os Ma'åse'* to her for her selfless and tenured commitment to serving our youth, women, and families in their personal, educational, and professional development.

1 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF *I* 2 *MINA'TRENTAI UNU NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN*:

3 WHEREAS, Dr. Josephine Cenzon Caluag is an academic, consummate 4 professional, and volunteer whose distinguished career spans service in public and 5 private education, private industry, and as an entrepreneur; and

6 WHEREAS, over the course of fifty-four (54) years, Dr. Josephine Cenzon 7 Caluag has contributed a lifetime of service that has touched the lives of countless 8 numbers of students and families, as well as having enriched the communities, and the 9 organizations of which she was a member; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Josephine Cenzon Caluag began her career in June of 1958, as
an English teacher at St. Theresa's College in Manila, Philippines, and a High School
Professional Catechist (Public School) under the Brothers of De La Salle Christian
School; and

WHEREAS, in June 1960, Dr. Josephine Cenzon Caluag worked for De La
Salle Grade School, Taft Avenue, Manila, as a department chairperson and guidance
counselor, where she performed psychological testing, student assessment, individual
and group counseling, and developed parental involvement programs; and

WHEREAS, in June 1972, Dr. Josephine Cenzon Caluag continued on as the
department chairperson and guidance counselor with La Salle High School,
Greenhills, Mandaluyong, Rizal, where she also taught and concurrently served as
adjunct faculty of the Graduate Guidance Department; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Josephine Cenzon Caluag advanced in her teaching track, and in June of 1975, she was promoted to Associate Professor and Guidance Counselor, on top of her duties as the Department Chairperson at De La Salle University, Manila, Philippines, where she was responsible for the design and implementation of multidisciplinary programs; career guidance; teaching in college, graduate school, and continuing education programs for parents and faculty; research and textbook writing; college thesis mentoring; continuing staff development and training and evaluation; and where, within a couple of years, she participated in an Observation/Consultation Tour in the United States relative to community programs from California to New York that subsequently led to her starting a campus ministry program at De La Salle University; and

8 WHEREAS, in October of 1980, Dr. Josephine Cenzon Caluag pursued a 9 position with Malayan Insurance Company as the Personnel and Human Resource 10 Manager, with responsibility of over one thousand (1,000) employees and ten (10) 11 active employee unions, where she conducted employee assessments; career and 12 vocational counseling; on the job training for quality control; and training in 13 leadership excellence, time management, cost reduction programs, contract bargaining 14 agreements, improving work performance, and effective work habits; and

WHEREAS, from October 1982 to June 1993, Dr. Josephine Cenzon Caluag 15 16 served as the president of a private firm for effectiveness training and management 17 consultancy, where she conducted vocational programs for "out of school" youth 18 under the Office of the President of the Philippines, and as subsidized by the World 19 Bank. Such programs included training for managers, supervisors and employees; 20 vocational and career counseling; training on effective work habits, values and 21 attitudes, team building, supervision, improving employee performance, and 22 organizational assessments, thereby earning the firm national recognition for ten (10) 23 years as a Top Training Institution in the Philippines; and

WHEREAS, from October 1993 to June 1996, Dr. Caluag served as a Guidance Counselor at St. Anthony Catholic School, *Tamuning*, Guam, where she provided individual and group counseling; taught seventh (7th) grade classes; conducted psychological testing and assessments of referred students; group guidance
 activities; student leadership training; workshops on conflict resolution and anger
 management; and where she was also a Rainbows Facilitator for training about sex
 education, as well as conducting staff development and a parenting skills program;
 and,

6 WHEREAS, Dr. Josephine Cenzon Caluag conducted community outreach in
7 collaboration with *Ina'fa Maolek*, the Alee Shelter, the Department of Youth Affairs,
8 and numerous other organizations on Guam; and

9 WHEREAS, from October 1993 to June 1998, Dr. Josephine Cenzon Caluag 10 served as the Director of Family and Youth Ministry for the Archdiocese of *Agana*, 11 where she conducted research, planned programs, trained, implemented and evaluated 12 programs relative to family and youth in twenty-four (24) parishes of the Archdiocese; 13 and

WHEREAS, Dr. Josephine Cenzon Caluag further faithfully served our youth by conducting leadership training for youth; organized World Youth Day Events locally and internationally; and initiated the Teen Abstinence program, as well as other programs for individual, couple, and family counseling; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Josephine Cenzon Caluag was involved and successful in grant writing, where she secured a five (5) year grant to the Archdiocese of *Agana*, Guam from the Catholic Extension Society of Chicago for the development and implementation of programs for Family and Youth projects for the twenty-four (24) parishes in the Archdiocese, in addition to securing a grant from the Institute of Parenting for Peace and Justice Network in St. Louis Missouri; and

WHEREAS, from August 1998 to the present, Dr. Josephine Cenzon Caluag
served as a Guidance Counselor for the Guam Department of Education at Maria A.
Ulloa Elementary School, where she conducted psychological testing and assessment

1 of referrals; individual and group counseling of children referred for behavior and 2 learning problems; provided support programs for teachers and parents (Helping the 3 Disruptive Child, Skills Training for Children with Behavior Problems, Training For 4 Remediation and Intervention, Behavior Modification Programs, Peacemaking 5 Program for Safe Home-School Community), Chairing Child Study Team Meetings, 6 Retention and Promotion assessments, SAT 9 interpretation workshops for 7 administration, teachers, and parents, and other intervention programs as seen helpful 8 for the school community; and,

9 WHEREAS, Dr. Josephine Cenzon Caluag was instrumental in the design and 10 implementation of home-school community outreach programs; authoring of the 11 school leadership improvement plan grant; the Department of Education extended day 12 program; and for other administrator and teacher programs, and

WHEREAS, Dr. Josephine Cenzon Caluag has accomplished a tenured and distinguished career as a professional; entrepreneur; advocate for youth, women, and families; and as a citizen volunteer working to improve the living and learning conditions of men and women in her profession, education, and in her place of worship. She has, with dignity, class, and a profound degree of success, established a standard of excellence for many to follow; now therefore, be it
