## BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I

## 2 MINA'TRENTAI UNU NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

- WHEREAS, the Lyndon B. Johnson Elementary School (LBJES) Angels
- 4 and the Tamuning Elementary School (TAMES) Whales have continuously
- 5 achieved educational excellence under the leadership of Principal Katherine M.

Reyes and Assistant Principal Geraldine D. Quejado; as well as the dedicated and 2 hardworking faculty, staff, and involved families; and

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3 WHEREAS, for the past three (3) years, LBJES students have shown an 4 increase in scores for Reading, Language and Math of the Standard Achievement 5 Test-10 (SAT-10), with students performing in Levels 3 (proficient) and 4 (advanced). During SY 2009-2010, the SAT-10 district-wide rankings revealed 6 that among twenty-six (26) elementary schools, LBJES placed in the top four (4) in 7 all subject categories. LBJES ranked third (3<sup>rd</sup>) place for Complete Battery, fourth 8 (4<sup>th</sup>) place in Math, third (3<sup>rd</sup>) place in Environment, and fourth (4<sup>th</sup>) place in 9 Reading and Language. During SY 2010-2011, LBJES placed in the top two (2) in 10 all subject categories; and LBJES ranked first (1st) place for Complete Battery, first 11 (1st) place in Math and Environment, and second (2nd) place in Reading and 12 13 Language. In SY 2011-2012, LBJES placed in the top five (5) in all subject categories: first (1st) place in Math, second (2nd) place for Complete Battery and 14 Reading, fourth (4<sup>th</sup>) place in Environment, and fifth (5<sup>th</sup>) place in Language; and 15 16 WHEREAS, for SY 2009-2010 and 2010-2011, the TAMES district-wide rankings revealed that among twenty-six (26) elementary schools, TAMES placed 17 18 in the top ten (10) in all grade levels and subject categories. In SY 2011-2012. TAMES placed in the top four (4) in all grade levels and subject categories; for 19 Complete Battery, the Second (2<sup>nd</sup>) Grade students placed (4<sup>th</sup>); the Third (3<sup>rd</sup>) 20 Grade students placed second (2<sup>nd</sup>); the Fourth 4<sup>th</sup>) Grade students placed third 21 (3<sup>rd</sup>); and the Fifth (5<sup>th</sup>) Grade students placed fourth (4<sup>th</sup>). The TAMES students 22 who scored in the ninetieth (90<sup>th</sup>) to ninety-ninth (99<sup>th</sup>) percentile in academic areas 23 24 were recognized by the SAT 10, and received the following awards for their performance during SY 2009-2010 and 2010-2011: the National Award of Honor 25 26 (1-2 academic areas); the National Distinguished Award (3-4 academic areas); and

1 the National Award of Excellence (5 or more academic areas). Each year over a

2 hundred students are awarded for this exemplary accomplishment; and

WHEREAS, in 2008, Lyndon B. Johnson Elementary School received full accreditation, which is the maximum of six (6) years accreditation by the Western Association of School and Colleges (WASC). During a mid-term visit in March 2011, the WASC Visiting Team reaffirmed the six (6) year accreditation, which expires in June 2014. Tamuning Elementary School was granted three (3) years accreditation in 2008. During the three (3) year term revisit in March 2012, the WASC Visiting Team granted accreditation for three (3) additional years, to expire on June 30, 2015; and

WHEREAS, the LBJ and *Tamuning* Elementary Schools' programs include the Department of Education Extended Day (DEED), After School Tutoring, English as a Second Language (ESL), *Chamorro*, Special Education, School-wide Discipline (Positive Behavior Intervention System – PBIS), Summer School, Gifted And Talented Education (GATE), Rainbows, Character Education, and Youth Crime Watch; specifically to LBJ Elementary School are Direct Instruction (DI), Pre-K GATE, Reading is the Key, and Portfolio Showcase; and specifically to *Tamuning* Elementary School are Success For All (SFA), the Student Council, Big Sisters Big Brothers of Guam, the Academic Challenge Bowl, Mock Trial, Peer Mediation, Pre-School Autism, and the Pre-School Medically Fragile Program; and

WHEREAS, through Character Education, LBJES and TAMES concentrate, formally and informally, on stressing character qualities that maintain a safe and orderly learning environment, and that will ultimately equip students to be model citizens. Through this program, the schools' student discipline rate was consistently "Exceptional" throughout the school years; and

WHEREAS, LBJES and TAMES provided parents with workshops presented by teachers on strategies that parents used to get involved in their child's educational journey. The workshops were geared to building and improving relationships between families and schools, and most especially to improve and strengthen the parent-child bond. Teachers presented workshops on Establishing Learning Rituals in the Home; Motivating Your Students; Providing Learning Assistance in the Home; and Monitoring Your Students Educational Progress. The schools were able to help parents provide a foundation at home to support student learning at school. Parents that got involved and participated received a "Very Important Parent (VIP)" Award from LBJES, and a Parent Certificate of Appreciation from TAMES; and

WHEREAS, through the visits of the National Institute For Direct

WHEREAS, through the visits of the National Institute For Direct Instruction (NIFDI) Implementation Manager, the DI Building Coordinator and DI Peer Coaches, with trainings and workshops provided to teachers, the DI Program has proven to increase student achievement at LBJES, most notably with the school's Stanford Achievement Test (SAT) 10, and for SY 2011-2012, indicated that students continue to benefit from the DI program and that most students are performing within their grade level. At TAMES, through the visits of the SFA support team on a monthly basis and giving immediate feedback and trainings in the different areas of the program, thirty percent (30%) of the students were on grade level at the end of SY 2009-2010, forty-three percent (43%) were on grade level for SY 2010-2011, and sixty-two percent (62%) were on grade level for SY 2011-2012; and

WHEREAS, through the dedicated and hard work of the families, administrators, faculty and staff of LBJES and TAMES, extra-curricular activities were instituted, to include: the Big Bird Read-A-Thon; the IRA Read-A-Thon; the Isla Art-A-Thon; Constitution Day; the Talent Showcase; the Christmas and

1 Chamorro Programs; the Rainbows for All Children; the Science Fair; the Spelling 2 Bee; the Geography Bee; the Math Olympiad; the National "Teach Children to 3 Save"; the School Spirit Days; the Cultural Pride Parade; the Family and Character 4 Monthly Projects; the UNICEF Drive; the Harvest Carnival; Presentations by 5 GPD, GFD, UOG Nutrition, DPW, SWAT, Civil Defense, the Department of Agriculture, and the Department of Public Health & Social Services Alcohol and 6 7 Tobacco Prevention Section; the 5K Run/Walk; the Japanese Student 8 Exchange/Visit; the Special Olympics; the Valentine's Day and Holiday School Dances; the Math Olympiad, Kangaroo Math; 9 the United Nations Festival; 10 Recycling Drives; the Word of the Month Zumba; the Canned Food Drive; Clean to Read; Fieldtrips; I Am Loveable and Capable; the Word and Math Manipulative 11 12 of the Month; Career Day; Read Across America; the Jump Rope for Heart; and 13 the Scoring High 10 Test and Test Best (SAT Preps); and WHEREAS, the Lyndon B. Johnson and Tamuning Elementary Schools 14 15 have thriving community partnerships with the Korean School of Guam, Cost U 16 Less, Twinkles, Ironwood Estates, Payless Supermarkets, South Pacific Petroleum 17 Company, the *Tamuning-Tumon-Harmon* Mayor's Office, Paradise Fitness Center, the Guam Premier Outlets, Garcia's Optical, AB Construction, Ninja Restaurant, 18 19 the Guam Visitors Bureau, and the Department of Mental Health and Substance 20 Abuse; now therefore, be it 21 **RESOLVED,** that the Committee on Rules of I Mina'Trentai Unu Na 22 Liheslaturan Guåhan does hereby, on behalf of I Liheslaturan Guåhan and the 23 people of Guam, recognize and thank the administrators, faculty, staff, students 24 and families of the Lyndon B. Johnson Elementary School and the *Tamuning* 25 Elementary School for their focused and successful work, and for their dedication 26 to excellence in education; and be it further
