Relative to commending and congratulating Lydia Diaz Tenorio on the occasion of her retirement from the government of Guam after thirty-one (31) years of service at the Guam Department of Public Health and Social Services; and to further thanking her for her dedication to the many lives she has touched in so many ways.

3 WHEREAS, Lydia Diaz Tenorio is the daughter of the late Jose Tanaka 4 Diaz and Lourdes Salas Diaz, and along with her eight (8) siblings, was raised in 5 the village of *Tamuning*. She is married to Joseph Payne Tenorio, and they have two (2) children: Joseph and Stephanie; and now lives in the village of *Agana Heights* with her beautiful family; and

3 WHEREAS, Lydia Diaz Tenorio is an "everyday hero" who makes a 4 difference, acts courageously, and demonstrates qualities which many of us only 5 aspire to; and

6 WHEREAS, Lydia Diaz Tenorio does things routinely in the course of a 7 "typical day on the job," as she champions the needs and rights of our most 8 vulnerable children; and

9 WHEREAS, Lydia Diaz Tenorio manages to lead from a place of calm, 10 inner strength and grace, where we would find ourselves uncomfortable, fearful, or 11 overwhelmed with situations that Lydia has addressed with during her tenure at the 12 Bureau of Social Services Administration (BOSSA) of the Guam Department of 13 Public Health and Social Services (DPHSS); and

WHEREAS, Lydia Diaz Tenorio leads by example, never trying to draw attention to herself or her many accomplishments; she is a true collaborator, a resourceful problem solver, and is organized and accountable; and

WHEREAS, in 1982, Lydia Diaz Tenorio began her government of Guam
career working as a DPHSS Social Worker, and she has assumed increased
responsibilities in various positions, now serving as the Administrator of the
Department of Public Health and Social Services Bureau of Social Services
Administration (BOSSA); and

WHEREAS, Lydia Diaz Tenorio has exhibited outstanding leadership in the field of child welfare and human services on Guam throughout her years of service, always advocating for solutions and working out of the "silos" to complex children, youth and family problems; and

WHEREAS, many task forces, councils and inter-disciplinary teams have benefited from the commitment and dedication of Lydia Diaz Tenorio over the years, including the Military Family Advocacy Committee, the Sexual Assault
 Response Team Steering Committee and the Healing Hearts Center, serving for
 over twenty (20) years; and

4 WHEREAS, Lydia Diaz Tenorio is a founding member of the Foster 5 Families Association, ensuring support and promoting the mission of the 6 organization to help recruit foster families and support the children while in foster 7 care; and

8 WHEREAS, there have been many partnerships forged through the efforts of Lydia Diaz Tenorio, for and on behalf of BOSSA, with community and 9 10 nonprofit organizations to promote civic participation in the care of children, such 11 as the Kiwanis Club, who sponsor Easter activities annually; the over twenty-five 12 (25) years of sponsorship with the Sugar Plum Tree, who give gifts to our 13 manhoben and our manamko on Christmas; the Harvest Christian Church, who 14 collaborate on foster care recruitment; and with Sanctuary, Incorporated and Catholic Social Service, who provide emergency shelter and residential care for 15 16 homeless, abused and neglected children; and

17 **WHEREAS**, understanding the importance and professional responsibility to be participatory in policy, Lydia Diaz Tenorio has been active in the crafting of 18 19 bills that support program and policies that will strengthen a comprehensive and 20 responsive continuum of services for children and youth, such as the child care standards legislation; the elimination of the statutes of limitation for the reporting 21 of sexual assault against child victims; the establishment of a sexual assault 22 23 prevention education curriculum in all public schools; and the revision of Juvenile 24 Justice Codes, including the Family Court and Child Protective Services Acts; and

WHEREAS, exhibiting good teamwork values and embracing the system of care concepts, Lydia Diaz Tenorio assisted and contributed to the drafting and implementation of major federal grants, such as the grant from the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) to the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse to serve adolescents with serious emotional disturbances; and a second grant to the Department of Public Health of Social Services to develop Guam's Early Childhood System of Care, where she served as Interim Project Director providing much-needed leadership to ensure the infrastructure was in place and in compliance with grant requirements; and

WHEREAS, on January 3, 2012, the United States Department of Health
and Human Services, Administration on Children, Youth and Families wrote to
inform Lydia Diaz Tenorio that she was selected to receive the Commissioner
Bryan Samuels Award for exceptional contributions to the prevention and
treatment of child abuse and neglect on Guam; and

WHEREAS, because of Lydia Diaz Tenorio's consistent and remarkable work for Guam's children and families, depicting a high standard of service and deep commitment to her island, she is an inspiration to her staff, her colleagues, and the many community partners she has worked with over the years locally, regionally and nationally; and

WHEREAS, Lydia is a positive force on Guam, contributing to significant reforms in child welfare, early childhood, and systems of care. Despite the many demands for her time and the often serious nature of her work, Lydia maintains a fun-loving nature, a sense of humor, and the ability to enjoy the moment; and she has touched many lives in many ways, and Guam is a better place because of her; now therefore, be it
