WHEREAS, Ms. Teresita Quichocho Matanane was born on Guam on July 6, 1946. She attended *Barrigada* Elementary School, and she graduated from John F. Kennedy High School in 1965; and

1 **WHEREAS**, Teresita has been married to Ed for forty-seven (47) years, and
2 together they have two (2) children, Eddie and Tracy; and are also blessed with four
3 (4) grandchildren, Amanda, Alex, Amelia and Marvin; and

4 **WHEREAS**, Ms. Matanane worked at her first federal job for the Public Works
5 Center at the U.S. Naval Station, Guam, serving as a Clerk Typist. She then worked
6 as a Time Keeper at the Ship Repair Facility, Guam, and then at the Third (3rd)
7 Consolidated Industrial Relation Office (CIRO) now known as HRO; and

8 **WHEREAS**, Teresita later relocated to San Diego, California, to join her
9 husband who was stationed at the U.S. Naval Station, San Diego. While there, she
10 worked for Fleet Accounting San Diego as an Accounting Clerk; and

11 **WHEREAS**, Ms. Matanane was then promoted to Procurement Clerk GS-4 and
12 subsequently moved to the U.S. Naval Air Station, North Island; and

13 **WHEREAS**, from 1977 to 1980, Teresita's husband worked at NAS Moffett
14 Field, California; and she worked for the Naval Supply Center in Oakland, California,
15 as a Purchasing Agent GS-5, and she worked herself up to the position of GS-9; and

16 **WHEREAS**, from 1980 to 1984, Teresita's husband worked on Guam for the
17 U.S. Naval Hospital, Guam as Secretary/GS-4 for PWC Engineering. Teresita also
18 started as a GS-5 Purchasing Agent and then moved to a GS-9 Purchasing Agent, and
19 was involved in the process of getting the U.S. Naval Hospital Guam its own buying
20 authority; and

21 **WHEREAS**, from 1984 to 1988, Ms. Matanane worked at the U.S. Naval
22 Supply Depot, Guam as a Contracting Officer, Small Business Specialist and moved
23 to large contracts as Contract Specialist. In 1988, Teresita followed her husband to
24 Chicago where she worked at the Defense Contract Agency Region as a GS-7

1 Purchasing Agent. From 1988 to 1989, Teresita worked at the U.S. Naval Hospital,
2 San Diego as a Contract Administrative Officer and Contracting Officer; and

3 **WHEREAS**, when Teresita's husband was transferred in 1989, she followed
4 him to Subic Bay, Philippines where she worked for the Morale, Welfare and
5 Recreation for Subic as a Purchasing Agent and Contracting Officer until 1993. Later,
6 from 1993 to 1996, Teresita lived on Guam and worked for Public Works Center as a
7 Contracting Officer and lastly, she worked from March 1997 to December 2012 as a
8 Contracting Officer at the U.S. Naval Hospital Guam; and

9 **WHEREAS**, in addition to working at the U.S. Naval Hospital, Teresita also
10 has a passion for helping others, volunteering and gardening. She loves to plant and
11 has planted more than two hundred (200) betel nut plants, numerous flowers, hot
12 peppers, taro, sweet potatoes, and many other vegetables; and

13 **WHEREAS**, Teresita is a Eucharistic Minister who gives weekly communion
14 to the sick; and she ministers at the Santa Teresita Church and at the Naval Hospital.
15 Ms. Matanane also visits, prays and reads the bible with females in Post 8 at the
16 Department of Corrections. She also does the same and assists in the celebration of
17 Mass for those at the Department of Youth Affairs. In addition, Teresita is the Past
18 President and Treasurer for the Sr. Legion of Mary and is also the President for the Jr.
19 Legion of Mary, meeting with twenty-five (25) children, ranging from seven (7) to
20 seventeen (17) years old, every Friday night. She also visits and prays the rosary with
21 different families at their homes in *Mangilao* throughout the week; now therefore, be
22 it

24 *Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people
