Relative to acknowledging award-winning filmmaker Rob Stewart for his advocacy in providing positive attention for sharks and exposing the environmental and over-fishing realities faced by sharks; for debunking shark stereotypes; for educating the public on these issues; for building support for their survival, and for creating the epic, world-renowned documentary, Sharkwater."

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA'TRENTAI UNU NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, Rob Stewart's career as an award-winning filmmaker and shark advocate began at the age of thirteen (13) when he became interested in photographing the beautiful underwater world; and

WHEREAS, Stewart eventually became a SCUBA instructor, prior to earning a Bachelor of Science degree in Biology, and worked as chief photographer for the Canadian Wildlife Federation's magazines, winning awards as a freelance photojournalist, leading expeditions to remote areas of the world and logging thousands of hours under water, using the latest re-breather and camera technologies; and

WHEREAS, Stewart's award winning library of underwater photography has been sought out by well-respected media companies around the world, including BBC Wildlife, Discovery Channel, ABC, Asian Diver, Entertainment Tonight, and National Geographic Magazine; and

WHEREAS, during an assignment to photograph sharks in the Galapagos Islands, Stewart discovered illegal longlining taking place and the indiscriminate killing of sharks within the area's marine preserve; and

WHEREAS, he began promoting shark awareness through print campaigns, but received little response from the public, so he began a film project in order to bring people closer to sharks, and at the age of twenty-two (22), Stewart left his still photography career behind and embarked on a remarkable four year journey through fifteen (15) different countries to create what eventually became his epic documentary, *Sharkwater*, which was released in 2006; and

WHEREAS, Sharkwater exposes the process of shark finning, which involves the catching of sharks to cut off their fins, which are considered a delicacy in some cultures, the result of the "finning" leaving the shark helpless because it is unable to swim, and after the animals are thrown back into the ocean they die; and

WHEREAS, this incredible documentary features corruption, espionage, battles with shark poachers in Guatemala that result in ramming by pirate boats, gunboat chases, mafia espionage, corrupt court systems and attempted murder charges; and

WHEREAS, *Sharkwater* exposes the reasons that these magnificent predators have become prey, and despite surviving millions of years throughout earth's history of mass extinctions, these animals could easily become extinct in a few years due to human greed; and

WHEREAS, the brutality of shark finning, the indiscriminate killing of any shark regardless of age, size, or species, and the use of longlines to harvest sharks in fishing operations, have all contributed to massive losses in shark populations worldwide; and

WHEREAS, Sharkwater has brought to the forefront of educational discussion the increase in shark finning over the past decade due to increased demand for the highly sought-after fins, improved fishing technology, and improved market economics, leading to estimates that 100 million sharks are killed for their fins annually; and

WHEREAS, Sharkwater exposes shark finning as unsustainable fishing because the massive quantity of sharks harvested and indiscriminate selection depletes shark populations faster than their reproductive abilities can replenish populations; and

WHEREAS, Sharkwater has been hugely successful, premiering in the Toronto Film Festival and winning a "Canada's Top Ten" award and became the most award winning documentary of 2007, winning over 30 awards at the most prestigious film festivals around the world; and

WHEREAS, The film has done much to debunk the stereotype that sharks are mindless eating machines, and as a result of *Sharkwater*, new educational awareness programs have been established worldwide to enlighten people of the invaluable contributions of the shark to our global ocean ecosystem; and

WHEREAS, Stewart continues his shark advocacy and continues to encourage global communities to learn that we must promote global sustainable use of the environment and oceans in order to reverse the centuries-old trend of gratuitous destruction; and WHEREAS, Stewart's commitment and tireless efforts toward shark advocacy and building support for shark survival has promoted the roles of environmental preservation and ocean conservation to new levels; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'Trentai Unu Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people of Guam, recognize, congratulate and offer its strong endorsement for the extraordinarily high standards set by Rob Stewart in his global shark advocacy and ocean conservations efforts that seek to expose the environmental and over-fishing realities faced by sharks; for his active role in debunking shark stereotypes; for his assistance in educating the public on these issues; for building support for their survival, and for creating the epic, world-renowned documentary, *Sharkwater*; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Speaker and Chairperson of the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'Trentai Unu Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* certify and the Legislative Secretary attest the adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to filmmaker Rob Stewart; to shark preservation advocacy organization "Shark Savers," on which Stewart sits as a member of its board; and to Edward J.B. Calvo, *I Maga'lahen Guåhan*.
