2	affects nearly 280,000 women in the United States; and
3	WHEREAS, while men account for most HIV/AIDS cases, the
4	impact on women is growing and research shows that, when compared to
5	men, women face gaps in access and care; and
6	WHEREAS, the new Affordable Care Act and the National
7	HIV/AIDS Strategy will prohibit insurance plans from putting lifetime caps
8	on the dollar amount that they will spend on benefits, eliminating the risk of
9	losing access to care; and
10	WHEREAS, The Affordable Care Act will help those living with
11	HIV/AIDS be better able to afford their medications; and
12	WHEREAS, The National HIV/AIDS Strategy will help:
13	(a) Reduce the number of people who become infected with HIV;
14	(b) Increase access to care and optimize health outcomes for people
15	living with HIV; and
16	(c) Reduce HIV-related health disparities; and
17	WHEREAS, WestCare Pacific Islands has been awarded a five-year
18	federal grant from the Office on Women's Health to provide prevention
19	education and supportive group counseling for girls ages 12-17 through a
20	program called Project Isa-ta; and
21	WHEREAS, Project Isa-ta aims to reduce the risk of contracting
22	HIV/AIDS and STI's among our young girls, as well as to increase self
23	esteem and positive body image, educate them on abuse, violence and a host
24	of other topics; now, therefore, be it
