RELATIVE TO PROVIDING MEASURES TO ADDRESS THE POSSIBILITY OF RADIATION EXPOSURE RESULTING FROM JAPAN'S NUCLEAR REACTOR INCIDENTS.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

WHEREAS, we must ensure that our people and our environment are protected from the harmful effects of the radiation fallout from the nuclear incidents that occurred at the Fukushima Dai-ichi Power Plant, Fukushima Prefecture, resulting from the 8.9 magnitude earthquake and the subsequent tsunami, and threatening the surrounding regions in Japan and the down wind areas; and

WHEREAS, we must protect our environment from radiation contamination caused by the wash off of radioactive materials transported via commercial airline flights from Japan, and the passage through down wind routes of commercial airline flights entering Guam, by heightening measures of inspection at Guam's A.B. Won Pat International Airport to contain incidences of further contamination on the runways and the surrounding soil environments, because runoff from the runways pose a high risk for contamination of Guam's northern aquifer; and

WHEREAS, military aircraft entering Guam from Japan, and traveling through down wind areas of nuclear contamination, land at Andersen AFB, which is situated on top of Guam's northern aquifer, the island's main source of drinking water; and

WHEREAS, these aircraft are prone to be contaminated and must undergo mandatory inspections for levels of radioactivity upon arrival at Andersen AFB to mitigate any seepage of nuclear contaminants from wash-off of the planes that can contaminate Guam's northern aquifer; and

 WHEREAS, in response to these potential threats of nuclear contamination, mitigation measures must also be instituted at the Jose D. Leon Guerrero Port Authority of Guam and at the Naval Base Guam to avoid nuclear contamination through heightened inspection of all commercial and military vessels that have travelled through the areas exposed to radiation from the Fukushima Dai-ichi Power Plant; and

WHEREAS, only through vigilant and thorough counter measures and preventative actions to quarantine sites and objects that are deemed radioactive will Guam and its people be kept safe from nuclear contamination; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*, on behalf of the people of Guam, does hereby request the Guam Environmental Protection Agency to work collaboratively with the Office of Civil Defense, the A.B. Won Pat International Airport Authority, the Jose D. Leon Guerrero Port Authority of Guam, the Office of the Governor, Guam's Delegate to Congress, the US Environmental Protection Agency and the US Department of Homeland Security to immediately implement appropriate mitigation efforts to address nuclear radiation fall out, run-off and wash-off resulting from stabilized surfaces on aircraft and maritime vessels that make routine trips between Japan and Guam as well as the down wind areas affected by the nuclear incidents that have occurred in Japan; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*, on behalf of the people of Guam, requests the Governor of Guam to seek the assistance of the Commander, Joint Region Marianas, in ensuring that each military aircraft and vessel originating from Guam to assist in the humanitarian mission to aid earthquake and tsunami victims in the nuclear affected regions, and those military aircraft and vessels traveling through down wind areas of nuclear contamination, be required upon returning to Guam to have a full inspection for radioactive particles and dust that may have lodged itself on to stabilized surfaces; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the Speaker certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to the Honorable Congresswoman Madeleine Z. Bordallo, Guam Delegate to the United States Congress; to the Honorable Robert M. Gates, Secretary of the United States Department of Defense; to the Honorable Ken Salazar, Secretary of the United States Department of the Interior; to the Honorable Ray Mabus, Secretary of the United States Navy; to the Honorable Robert O. Work, Under Secretary of the United States

Navy; to the Honorable Jackalyne Pfannenstiel, Assistant Secretary of the United States Navy (Energy, Installations and Environment); to the Honorable Anthony M. Babauta, Assistant Secretary for Insular Areas, United States Department of the Interior; to Mr. Jared Blumenfeld, US EPA Region 9 Administrator; to Ms. Nancy L. Ward, Regional Administrator, US Department of Homeland Security Federal Emergency Management Agency Region IX; to Rear Admiral Paul J.
