- 2 MINA'TRENTAI UNU NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:
- WHEREAS, the late Jose Espinosa Santos, a native son of Guam, was born
- on June 23, 1933, one (1) of the five (5) children of the late Tomas Taitano and
- Joaquina Mata Espinosa Santos; and who was called to his eternal rest on March
- 6 9, 2011 at Parkview Community Hospital in Riverside, California; and
- WHEREAS, growing up, Jose Espinosa Santos, was a student at
- 8 Mongmong Elementary School; and during his high school years, attended and
- was part the Seminary at Father Dueñas Memorial High School in Tai, Mangilao;

WHEREAS, after graduating from high school, Jose went on to serve as an 10 Internal Revenue Agent with the Department of Revenue and Taxation for over 11 eighteen (18) years, which began his lifetime of civil service; and 12 WHEREAS, in 1958, Jose continued his desire to serve upon entering the 13 United States Army and serving two (2) years before receiving an Honorable 14 Discharge with a Good Conduct Medal in September 1960; and 15 WHEREAS, several years after being honorably discharged from the 16 United States Army, Jose ran for Mayor of Mongmong-Toto-Maite and was 17 elected on January 8, 1973 serving one (1) term of four (4) years until January 10, 18 1977; and 19 WHEREAS, on April 8, 1973, Jose was ordained a permanent Deacon for 20 the Archdiocese of Agana at the Dolce Nombre de Maria Cathedral-Basilica in 21 Agana administered by the late Most Rev. Archbishop Felixberto C. Flores, D.D.; 22 Deacon Jose was assigned to serve at the Immaculate Heart of Mary Catholic 23 Church in Toto for thirty-eight (38) years; and 24 WHEREAS, in continuing his civil service, from May 11, 1977 to February 25 6, 1979, Jose served as the Special Assistant to the Chief Commissioner for the 26

Mayors' Council of Guam; and

WHEREAS, from February 7, 1979 to September 30, 1983, Jose served and retired as the Deputy Chief Executive Officer of the Mayors' Council of Guam; and

WHEREAS, seven (7) years after retirement, on April 16, 1990, Jose returned to serve as the Chief Executive Officer for the Mayors' Council of Guam then on December 2, 1993, became the Executive Director and retired on September 29, 1995; and

WHEREAS, Deacon Jose was a devout Catholic and dedicated parishioner of the Immaculate Heart of Mary Catholic Church in Toto, active member of the Toto Holy Name Society and Cursillio, Fourth degree Knights of Columbus, and served as the Chaplain and Scouts Master for the Boy Scouts of America, Guam; and

WHEREAS, in 1996, Deacon Jose was catechized into the Neocatecumenal Way of Guam and part of the second (2nd) Community of Agana; In 2000, Deacon Jose traveled to Rome for the annual World Youth Day which was initiated by the late Pope John Paul II.

WHEREAS, the late Reverend Mr. Jose Espinosa Santos is survived by his wife, Pilar Rosario Cepeda Santos; He is blessed with eleven (11) children; twenty-seven (27) grandchildren; and two (2) great grandchildren; now, therefore,

RESOLVED, that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'Trentai Unu Na* 48 49 Liheslaturan Guåhan does hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, honor Rev. Mr. Jose Espinosa Santos for his dedication and commitment to serving our island 50 of Guam and the Catholic Church community through his hard work, profound 51 faith, and inspiration; does extend its most sincere Un Dångkolo Na Si Yu'os 52 Ma'ase to him for his efforts in faithfully serving Guam, its culture, and its 53 Catholic religion through his works; and does further extend condolences to his 54 family on his passing; and be it further 55 **RESOLVED**, that the Speaker and the Chairperson of the Committee of 56 Rules certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the adoption hereof, and that 57 copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to Rev. Mr. Jose Espinosa Santos; to 58 Mrs. Pilar Rosario Cepeda Santos; and to the Honorable Edward B.
