
I MINA TRENTAI UNU NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN 2011 (FIRST) Regular Session

Relative to commending and acknowledging those affected by autism, and their families, for their sacrifice and dedication to bettering the lives of their children; and to commending the Autism Community Together (ACT) for their efforts to promote autism awareness; and in the observance of the month of April 2011 as "Autism Awareness Month."

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BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA TRENTAI UNU NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, autism is a complex developmental disability that typically appears during the first three (3) years of a person's life and affects their ability to communicate and interact with others;

WHEREAS, autism is defined by a certain set of behaviors and is a "spectrum disorder" that affects individuals differently and to varying degrees;

WHEREAS, autism is four (4) times more prevalent in boys than girls and knows no racial, ethnic, or social boundaries;

WHEREAS, there is no known single cause for autism, but increased awareness and funding can help families today;

WHEREAS, in December 2009, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention issued their autism prevalence report and concluded that the prevalence of autism had risen to one (1) in every one hundred ten (110) births in the United States, and to almost one (1) in seventy (70) boys;

WHEREAS, thirteen million (13,000,000) American families are now living

with the effects of autism spectrum disorder, and the Autism Society currently estimates that the lifetime cost of caring for a child with autism ranges from \$3.5 million to \$5 million; WHEREAS, the United States faces almost \$90 billion annually in costs for autism; and together with appropriate education and intervention, are vital to the future growth and development of individuals with autism; WHEREAS, through the increased awareness, and the services available to individuals with autism, the lives of our friends with autism can be made easier, while those without autism can expand their understanding of the needs and challenges that individuals with autism are experiencing; WHEREAS, parents, support groups, researchers, and professionals have dedicated years of service in their ongoing efforts to advocate for the rights, humane treatment, and appropriate education of all persons with autism; and in order to highlight the growing need for concern and awareness about autism, the Autism Society has been celebrating "National Autism Awareness Month" since the 1970s in the United States, recognizing the month of April as a time of special opportunity to educate the public about autism and issues within the autism community; WHEREAS, a proclamation will be signed declaring April 2011 as Autism Awareness Month, when every resident of Guam is invited to participate in activities that educate and promote awareness of autism spectrum disorders that affect members of our community and their families; WHEREAS, Autism Community Together (ACT), formed in January 2004, is spearheading an awareness effort in order to educate parents, professionals and the general public about autism and its effects; and, various activities are being coordinated throughout the month of April 2011 to further these goals, including a family day of bowling at Central Lanes in Tamuning; a display and

2	Hagåtña to the Micronesia Mall in Dededo to include a luncheon at the ASC food
