FOR ITS OUTSTANDING ACCOMPLISHMENTS IN THE
COMMUNITY.**

1 **BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'TRENTAI UNU NA**
2 **LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:**

3 **WHEREAS**, the Chinese Chamber of Commerce of Guam (CCCG)
4 has a long established organizational history in Guam, having been
5 originally incorporated on August 20, 1993, as the Chinese Merchants
6 Association of Guam; and

7 **WHEREAS**, the original organizers were well respected members of
8 the business community of Guam, including Mr. Michael Lin, Dr. Peter
9 Wang, Mr. Frank Yu, and Mr. John Shen; and

10 **WHEREAS**, in 2002, the CMA dedicated a state-of-the-art Goddess
11 of Life Chinese Memorial Monument at the Guam International Airport, in
12 commemoration of the settlement of Chinese ancestors on Guam and to

1 show the Chinese community's appreciation to the people of Guam for the
2 beautiful island home of Guam; and

3 **WHEREAS**, in 2005, at a duly called meeting of the Chinese
4 Merchants Association, over two-thirds of the members adopted a resolution
5 which changed the name of the Association to the Chinese Chamber of
6 Commerce of Guam; and

7 **WHEREAS**, the purpose of the name change was to enable the
8 CCCG to participate in a world-wide organization of similar business
9 groups; and

10 **WHEREAS**, on October 13, 2005, the Department of Revenue and
11 Taxation of the Government of Guam issued an Incorporation Certificate
12 which formally recognized the Chinese Chamber of Commerce of Guam as
13 a duly licensed Guam Non-Profit Corporation; and

14 **WHEREAS**, the mission of the CCCG is to unite all Chinese
15 businesses, to contribute to the Guam business community, and to provide
16 various services and benefits to the members of the organization; and

17 **WHEREAS**, a number of Past Presidents have ably guided the CCCG
18 and its Predecessor, including Michael Lin, Frank Yu, Peter Wang, John
19 Shen and Alfred Lam; and

20 **WHEREAS**, the CCCG is an active force in Guam's community
21 through public service, charitable donations and social events, and its
22 members embody a spirit of camaraderie and a desire for all to succeed; and

23 **WHEREAS**, the CCCG co-sponsored the Red Ball of the American
24 Red Cross in 2009; and

25 **WHEREAS**, the CCCG, through the leadership of its President
26 George Lai, became aware in December 2009 that more than 2000 children
27 on Guam would not receive toys or gifts during the holidays; and in response

1 thereto, launched a toy drive which resulted in nearly 2,200 toys being
2 donated to the Salvation Army; and

3 **WHEREAS**, again in 2010, the President of CCCG determined that
4 no children would be left behind on Guam for Christmas, and the CCCG
5 again undertook a toy drive that resulted in over \$20,000.00 worth of toys
6 being donated to the Salvation Army; and

7 **WHEREAS**, the Salvation Army awarded the CCCG the Top
8 Volunteer of the Year Award for (2009), and a “Community Volunteer
9 Award” for 2010; and

10 **WHEREAS**, the “Mixers” organized by CCCG over the past years
11 have been well attended by many members of the local business community,
12 including people of all ethnic backgrounds; and

13 **WHEREAS**, the CCCG has hosted a number of trade missions
14 including business groups from Australia and Taiwan, have been actively
15 involved in issues related to the Guam military buildup coordination and
16 cooperation with committees of the executive branch of the government, the
17 Legislature, and the federal government; and

18 **WHEREAS**, the CCCG has sponsored several highly successful
19 Chinese New Year parties, including the most recent celebration at the Leo
20 Palace Resort for the Year of the Golden Rabbit; and

21 **WHEREAS**, it has been recognized by the Guam Office of the U.S.
22 Small Business Administration (SBA) that the members of the Chinese
23 Chamber of Commerce of Guam have represented “the very best that Guam
24 has to offer in the areas of small business achievement and small business
25 advocacy of which special impact made by these outstanding small business
26 owners and, as champions of Guam’s entrepreneurs, has greatly contributed
27 to the economic wellbeing of Guam and its neighboring islands”; and

1 **WHEREAS**, the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA), in
2 virtually every year since 1990, has consistently recognized the
3 accomplishments of businesses in the CCCG and has granted awards to its
4 members including: Small Business Person of the Year, Minority Small
5 Business Champion of the Year, Financial Services Champion of the Year,
6 Young Entrepreneur Champion of the Year, Women in Business Champion
7 of the Year, and others; and

8 **WHEREAS**, in 2010, the U.S. Small Business Administration gave
9 highly coveted awards to the following CCCG members in three separate
10 categories including:

11 1) 2010 Small Business Person of the Year to Mr. Fong S. Wu,
12 President of Sunny Wholesale and Pago Bay Resort. Mr.
13 Fong S. Wu serves as CCCG Vice President;

15 2) 2010 SBA Minority Small Business Champion of the Year
16 to Mr. Jack W. W. Chan, Vice President and co-owner,
17 Kwong Hwa Trading Co. (Guam) inc. dba Home Mart. Mr.
18 Jack W. W. Chan serves as a Director on the CCCG Board
19 of Directors and Chairman of the CCCG Membership
20 Committee;

22 3) 2010 SBA Women in Business Champion of the Year to
23 Mrs. Linda L. Tung, President of GIT International Tours
24 Inc. Mrs. Linda L. Tung serves as a Director on the CCCG
25 Board of Directors and Chairwoman of the CCCG Tourism
26 Committee.

1 **WHEREAS**, an Official Ceremony by the USSBA Guam Branch for
2 the above awards was held at the Multi-Purpose Conference Center at the
3 newly completed Latte of Freedom at Adelup, presided by Governor Felix
4 Camacho, First Lady Joann Camacho, U.S. Congresswoman Madeleine Z.
5 Bordallo, and Mr. Ken Lujan, USSBA Guam Branch Manager; and

6 **WHEREAS**, in 2011, the following CCCG members have been
7 selected for highly coveted small business awards by the U.S. Small
8 Business Administration:

10 1) 2011 Small Business Person of the Year to Mr. Cencio Tan
11 C. Vy, President of Benson Enterprises. Mr. Cencio Tan C. Vy
12 serves as CCCG Vice President;

13
14 2) 2011 SBA Minority Small Business Champion of the Year to
15 Mr. Albert Wu, President and co-owner, FADA Development
16 LLC. Mr. Albert Wu serves as Executive Vice President of the
17 CCCG.

19 **WHEREAS**, CCCG's Executive Committee Chairman and Past
20 President Alfred Lam became Guam's Ambassador of Goodwill, appointed
21 by Governor Felix Camacho, during the CCCG's New Year Gala (5 Tigers
22 Gala) held at the Hyatt Regency on February 5, 2010; and

23 **WHEREAS**, Ms. Anna Wang Kao, Founder and President of Genghis
24 Khan Furniture, and a long time member and Past Vice President of the
25 CCCG, received the highly prestigious 2010 Businesswoman of the Year
26 Award at the Gala Dinner held at the Hyatt Regency Hotel on April 24,

1 2010, in recognition of her success in business and significant contributions
2 to the community through charity and other humanistic services; and

3 **WHEREAS**, Board Members of the CCCG, headed by President
4 George Lai, attended the 7th World Summit of Chinese Entrepreneurs in
5 Macau from October 22-24, 2010, where over 1000 participants from more
6 than 30 countries (all major regions of the world were represented, including
7 Asia, Europe, North and South America, Africa and Oceania); and

8 **WHEREAS**, the CCCG is comprised of more than 160 members,
9 which include both Chinese and non-Chinese, including some of the most
10 influential businesses in Guam among its membership; and

11 **WHEREAS**, the CCCG has undertaken substantial fundraising efforts
12 to assist the victims of earthquakes, typhoons, and tsunamis in such
13 countries as Taiwan, China, Haiti, the Philippines and Japan; and

14 **WHEREAS**, the CCCG is well respected for its contributions for its
15 continued donations to the island's business community and its active
16 participation in and service to the entire island of Guam; and
