- the eldest of five (5) children of Jose L.G. and Agnes Manibusan Camacho; and 4

- WHEREAS, growing up, William attended St. Anthony Catholic School in 6
- Tamuning, Guam and went on to attend and graduate from high school in 7
- Lompoc, California; At a very young age, William always expressed a love for 8
- tennis, a sport he excelled in; and 9

WHEREAS, after graduating from high school, William attended Hawaii Pacific University in the mid to late 1980s where he nurtured his love for tennis, playing competitively, not only for Hawaii Pacific University, but the University of Hawaii as well; and

WHEREAS, William returned to Guam in 1990; In 1992, William succeeded in establishing his first business venture, opening "Mecca," a boutique specializing in the sale of men and women's clothing and accessories; and WHEREAS, in the year 2000, as a testament to his entrepreneurial talents, William launched into another business venture, founding "Botanica," a

manufacturing company specializing in the production of soap, candles and various small gift items distributed to Duty Free Stores and other tourist-oriented shops; and

WHEREAS, William, who never lost his passion for the sport of tennis,

became a member of the Guam National Tennis Team in 2006, attending the Micronesian Games; and also participated in the 2007 Pacific Games; and WHEREAS, William remained active in the local tennis community; In 2008, William became the President of the Guam National Tennis Federation, the governing body of the sport of tennis on Guam; and has been a tournament director for one of the organizers of majority of the local Guam National Tennis

Federation tournaments; and
