## RELATIVE TO RECOGNIZING KATHLEEN THELMA THOMAS FOR HER MANY DEDICATED YEARS OF SERVICE IN THE SOCIAL WORK FIELD AND HER TIRELESS EFFORTS TO IMPROVE THE QUALITY OF LIFE FOR THE PEOPLE OF GUAM.

## BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA'TRENTAI UNU NA LIHESLATURAN GUAHAN:

WHEREAS, Kathleen Thomas, affectionately known as Kate, was
born on December 30, 1953 to Steven and Sally Thomas and was raised on
the island of Guam; and

WHEREAS, Kate Thomas, a true "Islander" in every sense of the
word, graduated from John F. Kennedy (JFK) High School, CLASS of 1972;
and

WHEREAS, Kate is survived by her daughter Kathleen and son- in-9 law Tommy Benavente, along with her four grand children Donavin, Byron, 10 Kaeleen and Allysa, and two great-grand children, Tiffany Jane and 11 Ayvie'anuh Castro. Her siblings include her brother Steve (Arizona) and 12 13 Sisters Carmelita (South Carolina), Angelina (Texas) and Sarah (Latte Plantation, Guam). Her extended family includes her lifelong friends, God 14 children, and other relatives in Guam, the Philippines and the U.S. mainland; 15 16 and

1 WHEREAS, Kate's dear sister Sarah, testified at her funeral that in 2 all her relationships, Kate undoubtedly gave the best of her love; and

WHEREAS, shortly before Kate's passing, on a drive to the mountains in the Philippines, Sarah recalled Kate singing the song "Best of My Love" so beautifully and eloquently. Kate was indeed blessed with the gift of voice, as many people fondly remember her as the lead female vocalist for the popular bands *Breezin*' and *Konfrence*; and

8 WHEREAS, the mother-daughter relationship she shares with 9 Kathleen is particularly special not only because they share the same name 10 but rather because she first came to her as a foster child, and the bond was so 11 genuine and real, that mother Kathleen made the adoption official shortly 12 thereafter; and

WHEREAS, this special relationship also aligns itself with Kate's lifelong commitment to social work, as she was, very appropriately, the President of the Foster Families Association of Guam, advocating for the well-being of foster children and prospective foster children island-wide. Her activities as the Association's President included providing emotional support, organizing get-togethers, facilitating fundraisers and trainings for foster parents; and

WHEREAS, Kate's commitment to social work includes over thirty 20 years of working in human services, accumulating extensive experience in 21 the field. Her career included a wide array of positions, including house 22 parent, crisis worker and caseworker for Sanctuary, Inc, Case Manager for 23 Guma Mami, Administrative Assistant for the Protection and Advocacy 24 Office, and her most recent position, Para Professional/Homemaker for the 25 Bureau of Social Services Administration at the Department of Public 26 Health and Social Services; and, 27

WHEREAS, Kate's many years of experience are complimented by extensive community services, such as her work as a certified mediator for the Inafa'Maolek Conciliation Service. Kate was often called upon to help people resolve all types of conflicts, but was known specifically for her specialty in child and family mediations; and

6 WHEREAS, Kate's volunteerism extended to her advocacy for the 7 National Motherread/Fatheread Family Literacy Program, based out of 8 Sanctuary Incorporated, which was a 15-week program held on Saturdays 9 that had parents reading to their children, in order to increase their reading 10 levels and build communication skills between them and their children; and

WHEREAS, Kate also advocated for the well-being of women, as she 11 worked closely with the Oasis Empowerment Center, a Center that works 12 with women recovering from drug and alcohol abuse, domestic violence 13 14 situations, or women that are having relationship problems with their partners. Initially involved solely as a Board member, Kate took it upon 15 herself to help facilitate a chemical recovery group once a week, which 16 resulted in her becoming a residential manager, assisting those in the first 17 stage of recovery as part of a three-stage program; and 18

WHEREAS, Kate's community services also included her facilitation
of the Chansa program at the Department of Youth Affairs, and a cofacilitator for parenting groups at Sanctuary Incorporated; and

WHEREAS, because of her love for animals, Kate was also a member of the Guam Animals in Need (GAIN), an organization that advocates for the rights of animals to be protected from maltreatment and to be in a safe and loving home; and

WHEREAS, Kate was also an advocate for physical fitness, nutrition,
 and health these last five years, as she was a contestant on the "Biggest
 Loser" show here on Guam; and

WHEREAS, Kathleen Thomas, like her highly respected
mother Sally, has also been an educator at San Vicente, Santa Barbara,
Maria Ulloa Elementary School, and with the Department of Education as a
CRT at F.B. Leon Guerrero Middle School; and,

8 WHEREAS, Kathleen Thomas has served on many task forces and 9 professional groups including being an officer for the Guam Association of 10 Social Workers and a Board member for Guma Mami, Inc, Payu-ta, and 11 Micronesian Youth Services Network (MYSN); and,

WHEREAS, Kate's outstanding contributions to the community are
well known and acknowledged. In 2005, she was awarded the Community
Service Award of the Department of Public Health and Social Services
Employee Recognition Program; and,

WHEREAS, in 2006, Kate was once again acknowledged for her
volunteerism when she was awarded the prestigious Public Citizens Award
from the National Association of Social Workers (NASW) Guam Chapter,
and the Governor's MagHope Award of Excellence later that same year;
now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that *I Mina 'Trentai Unu Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does
 hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, recognize Kathleen Thelma
 Thomas for her many dedicated years of service in the social work field, for
 touching the lives of so many people, for being an inspiration to all who
