Relative to voicing I Liheslaturan Guåhan's (The Guam Legislature's) vehement support for the full implementation of Public Law 110-229 and requesting that the US Secretary of Homeland Security, the Honorable Janet Napolitano, provide for the issuance of a China Russia Visa Waiver Program through her parole authority and the issuance of a broader final rule for the Marianas Visa Waiver Program

## 1 BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA' TRENTAI UNU NA LIHESLATURAN

2 GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, the US Congress passed Public Law 110-229, "The
Marianas Visa Waiver Program" to sustain the growth of the region's tourism
economy; and
WHEREAS, Guam's tourism industry is responsible for 20,000 jobs and
sixty percent (60%) of Guam's economic base; and
WHEREAS, Japanese visitors account for approximately eighty percent

9 (80%) of visitor travel to Guam; and

10	WHEREAS, recent natural disasters in the form of a powerful
11	earthquake, a massive tsunami, and the potential for widespread radiation
12	exposure, have continued to test the resilience and resolve of the Japanese
13	people and their economy; and
14	WHEREAS, these disasters have understandably impacted the
15	willingness of the Japanese economy and its people to engage in outbound
16	recreational travel; and
17	WHEREAS, industry experts have estimated that Japanese visitor arrivals
18	to Guam may decrease by fifteen to thirty percent (15% - 30%) in the short-term
19	and;
20	WHEREAS, policy leaders in Guam and Washington must take strong
21	proactive steps to avert an economic downturn; and
22	WHEREAS, declining Japanese arrival numbers will be offset by the
23	increased visitation that a Chinese Russia Visa Waiver Program will provide;
24	and
25	WHEREAS, Guam's inclusion in a China Russia Visa Waiver program
26	will provide Guam with the economic stability required for growth and progress;
27	and
28	WHEREAS, our neighbors in the CNMI have already been granted
29	parole authority, allowing the government of the Northern Marianas to presently
30	receive visitors from both China and Russia ; and

31	WHEREAS, this parole authority was granted to provide the CNMI with
32	a measure of economic stability in difficult financial times; and
33	WHEREAS, Guam must seek inclusion in a China Russia Visa Waiver
34	Program to access an estimated \$1.3billion in tourism revenues; and
35	WHEREAS, the US Congress, through its original construction of the
36	"Guam only Visa Waiver Program" recognized conditions unique to Guam; and
37	WHEREAS, in recognition of these unique conditions, Congress
38	authorized the "broad application of the mainland program" when considering
39	the criteria used to add countries to Guam's Visa waiver list; and
40	WHEREAS, a country under the former "Guam Only Visa Waiver
41	Program" would be considered for addition to Guam's waiver program as long as
42	that country had a US visa denial rate of 16.9% or lower; and
43	WHEREAS, the aforementioned allowance was not continued under the
44	existing Marianas Visa Waiver Program and that shortcoming may be mitigated
45	through the use of parole authority thereby allowing a China Russia Visa Waiver
46	Program for Guam; and
47	WHEREAS, each military base in Guam has its own perimeter and
48	internal security, thereby providing a protection to external threats, security is
49	not just at the airport, but also at each military facility; and
50	WHEREAS, visitors from China and other areas that may be of concern
51	to the Department of Homeland Security already have access to the island by

52	way of regular visas and the temporary foreign worker program - U.S.
53	employers are able to hire foreign workers on a temporary or permanent basis to
54	fill jobs in United States or its jurisdictions as will be the case in support of the
55	impending military buildup in Guam; and
56	WHEREAS, the Secretary of Homeland Security has granted the CNMI a
57	China Russia Visa Waiver Program by parole authority, and in so doing, has
58	demonstrated that security concerns regarding the presence of Chinese or
59	Russian nationals on U.S. soil has already been adequately resolved; and
60	WHEREAS, the congressional intent of Public Law 110-229 must be
61	fully recognized as the existing mandate of the land and should therefore be fully
62	executed; now, therefore, be it
63	RESOLVED, that I Mina' Trentai Unu Na Liheslaturan Guåhan does
64	hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, petition the Secretary of Homeland
65	Security, the Honorable Janet Napolitano, to immediately exercise her parole
66	authority and permit Guam's inclusion in a China Russia Visa Waiver
67	Program thereby recognizing the congressional intent of Public Law 110-229;
68	and be it further
69	<b>RESOLVED</b> , that the Speaker certify, and the Legislative Secretary
70	attests to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be thereafter be

- transmitted to the Honorable Janet Napolitano, the US Secretary of Homeland
- 72 Security; and to the Honorable Eddie B. Calvo, *I Maga'låhen Guåhan*.
