RELATIVE TO RECOGNIZING THE OUTSTANDING DEDICATION AND COMMITMENT OF THE JUDICIARY OF GUAM, U. S. DISTRICT COURT OF GUAM, AND THE GUAM BAR ASSOCIATION IN THE PROMOTION AND ADVOCACY OF JUSTICE AND EQUALITY FOR EVERY CITIZEN IN GUAM; EXTENDING A DANGKOLO' NA SI YU'OS MA'ASE' FOR THE TREMENDOUS SERVICE BEING PROVIDED TO THE ISLAND COMMUNITY; JOINS IN THE CELEBRATION OF LAW WEEK, APRIL 25 - MAY 1, 2011, AND IN COMMEMORATION OF THE FIFTY THIRD (53RD) NATIONWIDE ANNIVERSARY OF LAW DAY.

1 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF *I* 2 MINA'TRENTAI UNO NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, Law Day has been designated as a wonderful occasion for
the recognition and celebration of our nation's great heritage of liberty, justice
and equality under the law; and

6 WHEREAS, a viable and lively democracy requires the understanding 7 of the nature and basis of the freedom that every American citizen enjoys 8 today, and the acknowledgement of the tremendous responsibility each 9 individual has in the representation of these freedoms; and WHEREAS, Law Day provides an opportunity to celebrate the U. S.
Constitution and the laws that protect our rights and liberties, and to
recognize our responsibility as individual citizens to uphold the values of a
free and just society for all; and

5 WHEREAS, in 1958, Law Day was established and proclaimed by 6 President Dwight D. Eisenhower, and was reaffirmed through a joint 7 resolution by members of the U. S. Congress in 1961; and

8 WHEREAS, all citizens, both young and old, should understand their 9 individual rights and responsibilities under the law to become effective and 10 active participants in our nation's civil life, and positive contributors in 11 society; and

WHEREAS, Law Day is celebrated annually on May 1 as a special day of celebration by the nation and jointly by the people of Guam in appreciation of every citizen's liberties, and to provide a unique time for a reflection and rededication of the ideals of equality and justice for all under the laws of the land;

WHEREAS, the Law Week 2011 theme, "The Legacy of John Adams: from Boston to Guantanamo", which encourages individuals to reflect upon a particular time in history which has contributed tremendously toward the formulation of laws that protect the interests of the general public; and

WHEREAS, Law Week 2011 will provide the people of Guam and the legal community with a chance to understand and appreciate the many challenges and opportunities that had confronted the legal community in the

past and that continue to confront the legal community today, and to consider
the transformation of the justice system and the many programs that continue
to support the island community; and

WHEREAS, during the course of Law Week, the collective efforts of the 4 Guam Bar Association, the Judiciary of Guam, and the U.S. District Court of 5 Guam has scheduled numerous events and presentations that will highlight 6 the activities and services available within Guam's legal community for the 7 benefit of Guam's citizens, to include: community outreach programs, State of 8 the Judiciary Address, local and federal courthouse tours, swearing-in 9 ceremony for newly admitted Guam Bar members, fairy tale mock trials by 10 our island's youths, presentation of the Hustisia Award, naturalization 11 ceremony and citizen outreach programs at the U.S. District Court of Guam, 12 Law Day art and essay contest, short seminars on a variety of topics from 13 domestic to criminal matters, and the Law Fair at the Micronesia Mall; now, 14 15 therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Committee on Rules of I Mina'Trentai Uno na 16 Liheslaturan Guåhan does hereby, on behalf of I Liheslaturan Guahan and the 17 people of Guam, unite with the nation and the Guam community in 18 recognizing the tremendous service the legal community has provided and 19 continues to provide for all the citizens of Guam; and extends a warmhearted 20 Un Dangkolo' Ns Si Yu'os Ma'ase' as an expression of gratitude and 21 appreciation to all law practitioners, judges, and support personnel within 22 Guam's outstanding legal community who continue to promote the proper 23

and timely enforcement and interpretation of the law; and further joins in the
national celebration of the Fifty Third (53rd) Anniversary of "Law Day" on
May 1, 2011, and in the commemoration of Law Week from April 25-May 1,
2011, with the unique theme of "The Legacy of John Adams: from Boston to
Guantanamo"; and be it further
