successes; critical thinking and problem-solving skills, research and reading skills, oral
and written communication and presentation skills, and self esteem and confidence;

WHEREAS, The Guam History Day theme for this year is: "DEBATE & DIPLOMACY: SUCCESSES, FAILURES, CONSEQUENCES." Students were guided by their teachers to submit their work in the following categories: paper essays, exhibits, performance, documentary, and website. Each entry was judged at their school level and the winners in each category represented their school at the island-wide competition on March 19 and 26, 2011, at the 1911 Historic Lujan House in Hagåtña; and
