Taitano for his thirty-one (31) years of exemplary social work service to Guam's youth; to expressing Un Dangkulo Na Si Yu'us Ma'ase to him for his invaluable contributions to Guam; and to extending congratulations to him on his retirement, on behalf of the people of Guam.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA 'TRENT AI UNU NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

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- WHEREAS, Mr. Edward H. Taitano began his exceptional career at the 3
- Department of Education, Brodie Memorial School, on August 1980 as a Social 4
- Work Practicum Student whose duties included counseling, advocating for the 5
- rights of the handicapped and preparing and planning the educational program 6
- packets for handicapped individuals; and 7

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- WHEREAS, In October 1982, Mr. Taitano began working in the Department 8
- 9 of Public Health and Social Services (DPHSS), Medical Social Services, as a
- Social Worker I preparing psychosocial assessments on patients in the Services for 10
- Handicapped Children clinics, conducting home visits, and providing counseling 11

services to patients and their families regarding their family members medical 1 2 condition; and WHEREAS, In October 1984, as Social Worker II in DPHSS, Mr. Taitano 3 continued his diligent work in the Medically Indigent Program (MIP) by 4 explaining and interpreting the program policies and procedures of MIP to patients 5 and their families, providing counseling to patients regarding their medical 6 condition, assisted patients to help alleviate emotional, social and/or financial 7 problems related to their illness; and 8 WHEREAS, From August 1986 to March 1989, Mr. Taitano continued his 9 outstanding work as a Social Worker III at DPHSS in the Residential Treatment 10 Services Division providing primary care to emotionally disturbed children in the 11 Guam Manhoben Program (GMP), provided on-site counseling to assist with 12 adjustment problems and immediate crisis intervention to clients and their families 13 14 through the transitional phase of placement into GMP; and WHEREAS, Mr. Taitano provided subordinate social workers with guidance 15 relative to GMP policies and procedures, assisted in the planning and coordination 16 of GMP activities, assisted in planning, scheduling, and conducting case 17 conferences with other disciplines for treatment planning and evaluation of clients, 18 acted as a liaison between the subordinate social workers, residence staff and 19 supervisor and administrator of the program; and 20 WHEREAS, From 1989 to 1993 Mr. Taitano continued his dedicated work 21 to residents of Guam as a Social Worker III at the Department of Mental Health 22 and Substance Abuse in the Case Management Branch where he Conducted on-23 going client assessments and outreach follow-ups to ensure smooth client 24 25 adjustment and social functioning into the community for the adult mentally ill population; and 26

WHEREAS, Mr. Taitano coordinated and participated in case conferences 1 (i.e., Adult Inpatient Treatment meetings, Group Consults, Guam Manhoben and 2 Day Treatment meetings) for treatment planning and evaluation of cases, provided 3 supportive counseling to clients, their family and/or significant others and assisted 4 clients in overcoming the barriers of discrimination and stigma due to their mental 5 disability; and 6 WHEREAS, From 1993 to 1994, Mr. Taitano began working in the 7 Department of Youth Affairs (DYA) as a Social Worker III in Youth Development 8 9 to assist and rehabilitate Guam's youth; and 10 WHEREAS, Mr. Taitano Provided case management services to clients confined at the Youth Correctional Facility and Cottage Homes, provided each 11 minor with casework representation at court by presenting both verbal and written 12 reports of their progress and worker's recommendations during progress and 13 dispositional hearings. Mr. Taitano assumed the roles of liaison and advocate, 14 while collaborating with other agencies on the minor's behalf and maintained daily 15 contacts with Youth Service workers to insure compliance with all court orders. 16 treatment plans and stipulations; and 17 WHEREAS, Mr. Taitano developed a Counseling Unit with one licensed 18 therapist on board, and one Youth Service worker to assist in coordinating the 19 20 "Jumpstart" program, to transition clients back into their home environment, with 21 community and agency support; and WHEREAS, Mr. Taitano consulted with other specialists in the field of 22 counseling to ensure consistency of standards and professional ethics within this 23 unit and he continued to develop and modify the two programs, based on client and 24 staffing needs, relative to a youth correctional environment. Mr. Taitano 25 developed a database of all clients confined at the DYA and conducted daily 26

1 assessments to identify the treatments needed, and make the appropriate 2 recommendations; and WHEREAS, from 1998 to the present, Mr. Taitano has continued his 3 4 illustrious career in social work as a Supervisor I at DYA where he diligently continues his work relative to Work Planning and Performance Evaluation of 5 subordinate staff; to implemented and administered the Jumpstart Program and he 6 7 continues to develop, update and maintain the DYA Client Database and the Jumpstart Client Database; and 8 9 WHEREAS, Mr. Taitano has fulfilled various other tasks at DYA including Acting Administrator for Youth Development, Court Officer, Acting Casework 10 11 Supervisor; and WHEREAS, Mr. Taitano has inspired the minds of students at the University 12 of Guam where he was an Adjunct Instructor that taught SO 386 – Juvenile 13 Delinquency – and SO 400 – Fields of Social Work Practice: Youth Services – for 14 15 the Sociology Department; and WHEREAS, Since 2003, Mr. Taitano has been working in the Juvenile Drug 16 Court (JDC) Program as an Individual, Marriage and Family Therapist where he 17 18 works with families referred by the JDC program to identify problematic areas, dysfunctional thoughts and/or behaviors; and 19 WHEREAS, Mr. Taitano's innovations at DYA, teaching at UOG, and work 20 at DYA, DMHSA, and the DPHSS along with continuous participation in 21 community activities has made him an important altruistic asset to the residents of 22 Guam; now therefore, be it 23 **RESOLVED**, that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina 'Trentai Unu Na* 24 Liheslaturan Guåhan does hereby, on behalf of I Liheslaturan Guåhan and the 25 people of Guam, recognize and honor Mr. Edward H. Taitano, a proud father of 26

two sons and one granddaughter that is married to Karen Y. Taitano, for the

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invaluable contributions he has made for over thirty (30) years in social work, and

2 does congratulate him on the occasion of his retirement, and does further extend a

most sincere *Un Dångkolo Na Si Yu'us Ma' åse* to Mr. Edward H. Taitano for his

4 diligent dedicated service to our island and its people; and be it further
