3 WHEREAS, Master Chief Robert Joseph Reilly was born on January 26, 4 1962 in Brooklyn New York to Victoria and Charles Reilly. He is married to 5 the former Gina Tabonares and has one daughter Meagan Reilly and a 6 granddaughter Abbey Lane in Merritt Island, Florida; and

WHEREAS, in October 1981 Master Chief Reilly enlisted in the United
States Navy and attended the Recruit Training Command in Orlando, Florida.
Upon graduation he volunteered for the submarine force and attended Basic
Enlisted Submarine School in New London, Connecticut. While there, he was
selected to attend Quartermaster "A" School and went back to Florida in
March 1982 ; and

WHEREAS, Master Chief Reilly was assigned to USS Von Steuben SSBN 1 2 632 Gold in Newport News, Virginia as a Seaman Recruit. The ship was transferred to Charleston South Carolina where he served from May 1982 to 3 December 1985; achieving the rank of Quartermaster Second Class he 4 accepted orders to the USS Sturgeon SSN 637 also in Charleston South 5 Carolina, and served onboard until July 1987. He was transferred as an 6 7 emergency fill to the USS Francis Scott Key SSBN 657 Blue; where he was 8 promoted to Quartermaster First Class, and served as the ships Assistant 9 Navigator until October 1989; and

10 in 1989 then Quartermaster First Class Reilly assumed his WHEREAS, 11 position as Submarine Exercise Area Control Coordinator at the Commander Submarine Group TEN in Kings Bay, Georgia and was responsible for the 12 13 management of all local area submerged water from Cherry Point North Carolina to Corpus Christi Texas and was promoted to the rank of Chief 14 Quartermaster. Chief Reilly transferred in January 1992 to serve as Assistant 15 Navigator for USS Tennessee SSBN 734 Blue until April 1996, when he was 16 selected to attend the Defense Equal Opportunity Management Institute Cape 17 18 Canaveral Florida ; and

WHEREAS, Chief Reilly returned to Commander Submarine Group in
August 1996, and served as the Equal Opportunity and Drug and Alcohol
Advisor until January 1999. Assigned to the USS Kentucky SSBN 737 Blue, as
the Operations Department Senior Enlisted Advisor and Assistant Navigator,

1 he was promoted to Senior Chief Electronics Technician. In March 2002 he 2 transferred to Naval Ordnance Test Unit in Cape Canaveral and served as Assistant Port Operations Officer and DASO Test Engineer. Promoted to 3 4 Master Chief, he was requested to fill a critical billet at Commander Submarine Squadron FIFTEEN and transferred March 2005; Master Chief 5 Reilly executed his duties at Submarine Squadron Fifteen as Squadron 6 7 Operations Officer and Assistant Operations Officer for the only forward 8 deployed Submarine Squadron in the Navy until October 2008 ; and

9 WHEREAS, Master Chief Reilly held his last military position as the
10 Assistant Training Officer of Joint Region Marianas Training & Readiness
11 overseeing all Department of Defense military units, foreign military units
12 and numerous other government activities in the Marianas Range Complex
13 for Joint Region Marianas ; and

14 Master Chief Reilly always ranked at the top of the ladder WHEREAS, 15 during his entire Naval career, he completed 16 years at sea and received 16 numerous accolades and medals including the Meritorious Service Medal, 5 17 Navy Commendation Medals, 5 Navy Achievement Medals, 3 Battle 18 Efficiency Awards, 10 Good Conduct Awards, 2 National Defense Medals, 2 19 Global War on Terrorism Medals, 6 Overseas Service Ribbons, Expert Rifle 20 and Pistol and the Gold SSBN Deployment Pin for a total of 25 SSBN 21 Deployments; now, therefore be it
