Relative to recognizing and commending Mr. Rick Phillips MS Ed., for his outstanding contribution to the BASTA Bullying Prevention Conference and for joining in the promotion and educational outreach component of bullying prevention in Guam.

WHEREAS, Guam has joined communities across the country to celebrate National Bullying Prevention Month, during the month of October, in order to promote bullying prevention within our schools and community to support the needs of children; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Rick Phillips, MS Ed., is the executive director and founder of Community Matters (CM), a California based nonprofit organization whose mission is to engage, equip, and empower young people to be contributors and peacemakers in their schools and communities; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Rick Phillips, MS Ed., has appeared on numerous television programs, such as the Today Show, CNN, and in print, radio and regional/national interview programs as an expert in violence prevention and empowering youth; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Rick Phillips, MS Ed., is a published author, having written the books "Ten Years after Columbine: School Violence-Prevention Report Card" and "Safe School Ambassadors: Harnessing Student Power to Stop Bullying and Violence"; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Rick Phillips, MS Ed., is the creator and co-developer of the Safe School Ambassadors program, a youth-centered, violence prevention program that has been implemented in more than 900 schools in the United States and Canada; and

WHEREAS, members of the Judiciary of Guam and the Department of Education invited Mr. Rick Phillips, who is a nationally-recognized educator, speaker, facilitator, and trainer, to attend the BASTA Bullying Prevention Conference as a guest speaker to provide educational outreach aimed at reducing bullying and cyberbullying in our communities; now, therefore, be it
