WHEREAS, the Lyndon B. Johnson Elementary School (LBJES) Angels and Tamuning Elementary School (TAMES) Whales have continuously achieved under the leadership of Principal Kathy Reyes and Assistant Principal Geraldine Quejada, and the dedicated and hardworking faculty, staff and involved families; and,

WHEREAS, for the past three years LBJES students, have shown an increase in Reading, Language and Math on the Standard Achievement Test-10 (SAT-10) with students performing in Levels 3 (proficient) and 4 (advanced); during SY 2009-2010, SAT-10 district-wide rankings revealed that among twenty-six (26) elementary schools LBJES placed in the top four (4) in all subject categories; in SY 2010-2011, LBJES ranked 1st place for complete battery; 1st place in Math and Environment and 2nd place in Reading and Language for SY

2010- 2011, LBJES ranked 1st place for complete battery, 1st place in Math and Environment and 2nd place in Reading and Language for SY 2010-2011; and,

2	areas are recognized by the SAT 10, and TAMES received the following awards
3	for their performance during SY 2010-2011:National Award of Honor (1-2
4	academic areas), National Distinguished Award (3-4 academic areas), and National
5	Award of Excellence (5 or more academic areas); each year over a hundred
6	students are awarded for this exemplary accomplishment; and,
7	WHEREAS, in 2008 Lyndon B. Johnson Elementary School received full
8	accreditation by the Western Association of School and Colleges (WASC) during a
9	Mid-Term visit on March 2011, the visit reaffirmed the six (6) year accreditation
10	which expires June 2014 and Tamuning Elementary School was granted 3 years
11	accreditation in 2008; and
12	WHEREAS, LBJ and Tamuning Elementary Schools' programs include
13	Department of Education Extended Day (DEED), English as a Second Language
14	(ESL), Chamorro, Special Education, Summer School, Gifted and Talented
15	(GATE), Rainbows, Character Education, Youth Crime Watch; and specifically to
16	LBJ are Pre-K GATE, Reading is the Key; and specifically to Tamuning are
17	Student Council, Peer Mediation, Pre-School Autism, Pre-School Medically
18	Fragile Program; and,
19	WHEREAS, through Character Education, LBJES and TAMES
20	concentrate, formally and informally, in stressing character qualities that maintain
21	a safe and orderly learning environment, that will ultimately equip students to be
22	model citizens, through this program the school's student discipline rate was
23	consistently "Exceptional" throughout the school years; and,
24	WHEREAS, LBJES through Families and Schools Together (FAST)
25	Workshops present strategies that families can use to involve themselves in their
26	child's educational journey, parents that got involved and participated received a

- 1 "Very Important Parent" (VIP) Award, 55% of LBJES parents attended workshops
- 2 throughout the school year, 66% of parents received "VIP" Award; and,
- WHEREAS, TAMES through the visits of Success For All support team on
