WHEREAS, Ms. Nia Aitaoto M.P.H., M.S. received her M.P.H in Community
Health Development and her M.S. in Epidemiology from the University of Hawaii at
Manoa;

7 Community and Behavioral Studies at the University of Iowa, College of Public

9 WHEREAS, Ms. Aitaoto's aspiration to investigate the health disparities among
10 Pacific Islanders was brought forward by the caring of her ailing grandmother; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Aitaoto is currently the principal investigator of the Faith in
 Action Research Alliance and the coordinator for the Pacific Diabetes Education
 Program at Papa Ola Lokahi, where she provided health education, community
 mobilization training and technical assistance in American Samoa, Commonwealth of
 the Northern Mariana Islands, Federated States of Micronesia, Guam, Hawaii,
 Republic of the Marshall Islands, and the Republic of Palau; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Aitaoto has been awarded the prestigious R21 grant from the
National Institute of Health (NIH), this exploratory grant provides Ms. Aitaoto, and
her project team, with the opportunity to gather preliminary data on culturally
appropriate, evidence-based interventions for diabetes prevention and management
among Pacific Islanders;

WHEREAS, the R21 grant has brought together a team of academics, researchers and public health practitioners as well as community leaders and stakeholders to investigate this health disparity in the Pacific Islands and to develop innovative, and culturally-relevant, health interventions utilizing Community-Based Research model; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Aitaoto has also shared her expertise as a Health Resources
and Services Administration Grantee Technical Assistance Expert for Hawaii and
Guam and as a Contractor providing Cultural Competency Training; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Aitaoto has extensive experience in cultural competency
training with a focus on Pacific Island cultures; she has also published numerous
articles on issues of health in Pacific Island cultures; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Aitaoto extensive knowledge and experience in diabetes will
be beneficial for diabetes treatment and prevention and be helpful to the people of
Guam;
