Relative to expressing the support of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* for and recognizing the importance of the service of military reservists serving on Guam by urging President Barack Obama and the 112th United States Congress to reconsider funding cuts to the budget of the Department of Defense in accordance with the provisions of the Budget Control Act of 2011, and further encouraging the Department of Defense to reconsider any funding decrease to reserve military forces on Guam resulting from deficit reduction provisions of the Budget Control Act of 2011.

1 BE IT RESOLVED BY *I MINA'TRENTAI UNU NA LIHESLATURAN*

2 GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, the Budget Control Act of 2011 ("Budget Control Act") was passed by the 112th United States Congress on August 2, 2011, which resulted in the end of the United States debt ceiling crisis and had threatened to bring the country into sovereign default;

WHEREAS, the Budget Control Act increased the debt ceiling of the United
States by four hundred billion dollars (\$400,000,000,000.00) thus requiring the federal
to make nine hundred seventeen billion dollars (\$917,000,000,000.00) in spending
cuts over a ten-year period as a first installment to reduce the federal deficit, in
keeping with estimates from the Congressional Budget Office; and

WHEREAS, the Budget Control Act of 2011 also created the Joint Select
Committee on Deficit Reduction, also known as the Super Committee, which was

given a deadline of November 23, 2011, to identify and provide a recommendation for approximately one and one-half trillion dollars (\$1,500,000,000,000.00) in deficit reduction measures to be implemented over a ten-year period, as the second installment in accordance with the provisions of the Budget Control Act; and

WHEREAS, an extensive cut to military spending and the overall Department
of Defense budget was one of the deficit reduction measures identified by the Super
Committee; and

8 WHEREAS, on November 21, 2011, the Super Committee issued the 9 following statement which indicated their inability to reach a consensus: "After 10 months of hard work and intense deliberations, we have come to the conclusion today 11 that it will not be possible to make any bipartisan agreement available to the public 12 before the committee's deadline."; and

WHEREAS, the failure of the Super Committee to reach an agreement means
that the Department of Defense is mandated to implement approximately six hundred
billion (\$600,000,000,000.00) in across-the-board military spending cuts; and

WHEREAS, a large cut in military spending will result in a reduction in
 personnel to the active duty branches of the United States Armed Forces including the
 Guard and Reserve components; and

WHEREAS, according to General Ray Ordinero, Chief of Staff, United States Army, a significant decrease in guardsmen and reservists will result from a decrease in the size of the Army consequently limiting the Army's ability to aid local governments during national disasters and other emergencies; and

WHEREAS, similar detrimental effects will be felt in all other branches of the
United States Armed Forces; and

1 WHEREAS, Guam's reserve military forces bravely serve in defense of the 2 freedoms enjoyed by our island and country, and are important in assisting with local, 3 national and international crisis, conflict or emergency; and

WHEREAS, more than two thousand of Guam's military reservists will be 4 negatively affected by the proposed spending cuts but, because of many variables not 5 within their control, are unable currently determine what the actual impact will be; 6 now, therefore, be it 7

8 **RESOLVED**, that *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* recognizes the important societal 9 contributions of the Guam's reserve military forces and all other components of the 10 United States Armed Services, and be it further

11 **RESOLVED**, that *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* recognizes the vital defense role of Guam's reserve military forces and the United States Armed Forces in keeping our 12 island and country safe; and be it further 13

RESOLVED, that *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* recognizes the need to identify ways 14 15 to help reduce the national debt and improve the United States economy; and be it 16 further

RESOLVED, that *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* urges President Barack Obama and 17 the 112th United States Congress to identify and recommend other alternatives for 18 19 deficit reduction before making cuts to the budget of the Department of Defense; and 20 be it further

RESOLVED, that *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*, in recognizing and understanding 21 22 that spending cuts will inevitably be made to the budget of the Department of 23 Defense, encourages the Secretary of Defense to not make funding cuts to Guam's 24 reserve military forces; and be it further

25 **RESOLVED**, that the Speaker certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to General 26
