Relative to recognizing and commending Mr. Juan "John" Blas Perez on the occasion of his retirement from the University of Guam, and extending heartfelt thanks for his dedicated and exceptional service to the University of Guam students, faculty and island community for the past twentytwo (22) years.

## 1 BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'TRENTAI UNU NA

## 2 LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, during his first career as a seaman in the United States
Navy, Mr. Juan "John" Blas Perez dedicated his life to the protection and
service of the nation, and later to the students, faculty and community at
the University of Guam as part of the UOG Library Audio-Visual Division
– for a total of forty-four (44) years; and,

- 8 WHEREAS, Mr. Perez was born June 24, 1949 in the village of
- 9 Barrigada to the late Manuel Baltasar Martinez Perez and Efigenia Blas
- 10 Perez; and is the second eldest of eight (8) children, including June,

Bernadette, Joseph, Julie, Barbara, Marie, and Carmen; and is the proud
 father of Katrina Antoinette Perez; and,

WHEREAS, after graduating from George Washington High School
in 1967, the eighteen (18) year old, joined the US Navy on June 28, 1967 and
served a tour in Viet Nam; first, being assigned to combat store ship USS *Aludra* (AF-55) before serving on shore at Camp Tien Shaw in Da Nang,
Viet Nam, providing supplies to the US Navy and US Marines; and,

8 WHEREAS, Mr. Perez would serve on five additional ships including 9 the USS *Grasp* (ARS-24); the USS *Tripoli* (LPH-10), a helicopter carrier; the 10 USS *Ajax* (AR-6), a repair ship; the USS *Marvin Shields* (FF-1066), a fast 11 frigate; and, the USS *Ogden* (LPD-5), a landing personnel dock; and,

WHEREAS, it was on the USS Marvin Shields that Mr. Perez served as 12 acting division officer of the Engine and Fire Room, responsible for 150 13 people; and as the ship was out to sea for a six-month tour, starting in the 14 15 Western Pacific and navigating in open waters to the Indian Ocean and back to its homeport in San Diego, California; that the ship lost its water 16 distilling plant, which was vital to operations and life on board; and, over 17 the next forty-eight (48) hours, Mr. Perez, a Senior Chief Petty Officer, 18 worked tirelessly to repair the machine responsible for providing water to 19 run the ship's power plant boilers and to sustain life: provide water for 20 drinking, cooking and sanitation; for this, the ship's captain bestowed a 21 Navy Commendation Award upon Mr. Perez for his heroic efforts in 22 saving the ship; and, 23

WHEREAS, in addition to his sea service, Mr. Perez also served on 1 shore, returning to Guam after Viet Nam and working at the Naval Ship 2 Repair Facility (SRF) in Sumay from 1970 to 1974; initially, Mr. Perez was 3 assigned to security before moving to repair where he served as Waterfront 4 Superintendent which entailed assigning the ships to different workshops 5 within SRF according to the types of repairs or maintenance services 6 required; a task requiring exceptional organizational management skills; 7 8 and,

9 WHEREAS, another shore assignment Mr. Perez would take on was 10 as Company Commander, a boot camp drill instructor at Recruit Training 11 Command in San Diego, from 1983 to 1986 where he was responsible for 12 shaping hundreds of young men into US Navy Sailors who would join the 13 ranks of military service members in the protection and service of the 14 nation; and,

WHEREAS, Mr. Perez found this assignment fulfilling and a 15 prestigious duty because it dealt with helping young adults starting out in 16 a career, and oftentimes proud parents would approach him during "USO 17 Night" (a celebration the night before graduation) and ask, "Hey, Chief, 18 how did you do this in nine-weeks, when we've been trying for 18 years?" 19 WHEREAS, after twenty-two (22) years of service as a navy power 20 plant control man and refrigeration mechanic, and at the rank of Master 21 Chief Petty Officer (E-9), the highest achievable rank for a non-22 commissioned officer, Mr. Perez retired from the US Navy in February 23

1990 and would return to Guam, where he would begin his second career
 at the University of Guam; and,

WHEREAS, in October 1990, Mr. Perez began working at the
University of Guam after successfully interviewing for a position as a
Library Technician I at the University of Guam Library; in June 1993, Mr.
Perez became a multi-media technician for the library's Audio-Visual
Division; and,

WHEREAS, Mr. Perez carried his sentiments as a Company 8 Commander to his new position at the University where he has 9 exemplified the university's motto "Ina, Diskubre, Setbe" by example and 10 service despite suffering multiple heart attacks within two days in 2005, he 11 continued working, and his fortitude is attributed to his love for the 12 university and desire to continue to serve because he believes that each 13 student should be treated with respect, dignity and provided accessible, 14 courteous and quality service, and that without them "we" (the university) 15 "would not be here;" additionally, Mr. Perez takes pride in assisting 16 university faculty achieve the university mission; and, 17

WHEREAS, Mr. Perez has been a prominent fixture in the library,
coming to work as early as 6:30 a.m. to ensure that the doors are open,
classrooms and multi-media equipment are ready to receive students and
faculty when the library opens at 8 a.m.; and making himself available to
anyone who has any questions or needs technical assistance; and,

WHEREAS, over the years, Mr. Perez has received formal
recognition and commendations from the university for his participation
and efforts during biannual graduation ceremonies, the annual Liberation
Day Parade, the annual UOG Charter Day celebrations, quarterly UOG
Board of Regents meetings, and all the multi-media support needs of the
university on and off campus; and,

WHEREAS, Mr. Perez has served under the last five UOG
presidents, including Dr. Wilfred Leon Guerrero, Dr. John Salas, Dr. Jose
Nededog, Dr. Harold Allen and Dr. Robert Underwood; and worked with
the late Dr. Jeff Barcinas, former vice president of University and
Community Engagement for the University of Guam; and,

WHEREAS, Mr. Perez is active in Barrigada village's Catholic parish serving as a lector and Eucharistic Minister; and, also shared his love of music with the entire community as an active member of The Island Choralers men's choir from 1970 to 2010 where he also served as choir director from 2007 to 2010; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that *I Mina'trentai Unu Na Liheslaturan Guåhan*, on
behalf of the people of Guam does hereby, recognize and commend Mr.
Juan "John" Blas Perez on the occasion of his retirement from the
University of Guam, and extends heartfelt thanks for his dedicated and
