Relative to recognizing and commending the late Honorable Judge Ramon Valero Diaz for his service and the many contributions he has made to the people of Guam and to the preservation of peace and justice.

## BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINATRENTAI UNU NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

- WHEREAS, on October 13th, 1918, Dr. Vicente Lozada Diaz and Mrs.
- Bibiana Valero Diaz became the proud parents of Ramon Valero Diaz, the
- eldest of their four (4) children, in Manila, Philippines; and
- WHEREAS, in 1935, at the age of seventeen (17), Ramon Valero Diaz
- earned his high school diploma from the University of Santo Tomas,
- 6 Manila, Philippines; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Ramon Diaz earned his Associates' Degree in 1937, a
- 8 Bachelors' Degree in Philosophy and Letters in 1940 and a second
- 9 Bachelors' Degree in Law in 1941 at the University of Santo Tomas in

WHEREAS, Ramon Valero Diaz obtained the rank of Cadet Colonel 11 as the Cadet Corps Commander in 1941, as an Advance ROTC Graduate, 12 Department of Military Science & Tactics, University of Santo Tomas; and 13 WHEREAS, on June 27th, 1941, Ramon Diaz was commissioned as a 14 3<sup>rd</sup> Lt. Philippines Army Reserve, Quezon City, Philippines, and, on 15 August 30th, was called into Active Duty with the 41st JO "K" Company, 41st 16 Division, Philippines Army under the command of General Vicente Lim, 17 and was inducted into the United States Armed Forces of the Far East 18 (USAFFE) as an Infantry Line Officer assigned to Lipa, Batangas, the 19 following day on August 31st, 1941; and 20 WHEREAS, on February 10th, 1942, Ramon Valero Diaz was 21 promoted to the rank of 1st Lt., United States Armed Forces of the Far East 22 (USAFFE), Philippines Army; and 23 WHEREAS, on April 9th, 1942, tragedy struck when 1st Lt. Ramon 24 Diaz was captured by the Japanese Imperial Army and was held as a 25 Prisoner of War (POW) for nearly five (5) months at the Capas 26 Concentration Camp until September 2nd, 1942 when 1st Lt. Diaz was 27 released to his parents as a "Sick Parolee"; and 28 Whereas, finding his calling in his chosen profession, Ramon Valero 29 Diaz was first admitted to practice law as a member of the Philippines Bar 30 Association in 1941 and actively practiced law as a Legal Assistant from 31 1943 to 1944; and 32

Whereas, in 1945, Ramon Valero Diaz returned to military service in the Philippines Army at Camp Olivas on March 6<sup>th</sup>. He obtained his Graduate Diploma in Military Justice, War Crimes and War Claims from the University of Michigan, United States Army Judge Advocate General's School for Commissioned Officers, Ann Arbor, Michigan and was subsequently assigned as the Claims Branch Chief, overseeing over fifty (50) attorneys who adjudicated all types of war claims in favor of heirs under the laws of succession; and

Whereas, on July 3<sup>rd</sup>, 1946, Ramon Valero Diaz married his "soul mate", the beautiful Josefina de la Concepcion; and

Whereas, Ramon Diaz was eventually promoted to Permanent Captain on March 1948 and retired from military service in 1951 as a Permanent Captain with the Judge Advocate General Division (JAGD), Armed Forces of the Philippines; and

Whereas, in 1951, Ramon Valero Diaz moved to Guam with his family. He became a member of the Guam Bar Association in 1956 and became a naturalized citizen of the United States in 1958. Mr. Diaz continued his passion in the legal profession working for several notable Guam Law Firms as a praeceptor from 1951 to 1960. He was assigned as an Assistant Attorney to the United States District Court of Guam from 1960 to 1962. Ramon Valero Diaz entered private practice from 1962 to 1980; and

Whereas, Ramon Valero Diaz was assigned to the United States Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals in San Francisco in 1969, and the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands from 1970 to 1980; and

Whereas, on September 8th, 1980, former Governor of Guam, the Honorable Paul M. Calvo, appointed Ramon Valero Diaz serve as a Judge on the Superior Court of Guam. The Honorable Ramon Valero Diaz was confirmed by the Fifteenth (15th) Guam Legislature and served the people of Guam in his capacity as a Judge until his retirement on April 4th, 1994; and

Whereas, during his lifetime, the late Honorable Judge Ramon Valero Diaz received numerous Awards and Honors, notably, a Letter of Commendation in 1945 from the Judge Advocate General of the United States Army for "Exemplary Conduct" while attending the Judge Advocate General School, University of Michigan, was awarded the "Philippine Military Merit Medal" in 1981 by former Philippine President, Ramon Magsaysay, for "Outstanding Service" as the Chief of the Claims Branch in 1951, honored as an "Outstanding University of Santo Tomas Law Alumnus", and his biography was listed in "Who's Who in the West", "Who's Who in American Law" and "Who's Who in America"; and Whereas, the late Honorable Judge Ramon Valero Diaz also was also involved in several professional associations, notably, as a presidential appointee member of the United States Selective Service Appeal Board

from 1971 to 1976, Guam Bar Association member from 1956 to 1994, and the American Academy of Judicial Education member in the 1980's; and

Whereas, the late Honorable Judge Ramon Valero Diaz was also active in numerous faith-based organizations, notably, as a Fourth Degree Knight of Columbus in the 1950's, was ordained as a permanent Deacon for the Catholic Diocese of Hagatna on April 27th, 1973, was a Co-Organizer for the Knights of Columbus, Guam Council and Assembly in the 1980's and was a Founding Member and member of the Board of Directors, Catholic Social Services, Guam; and

Whereas, the late Honorable Judge Ramon Valero Diaz was also active in several Civic Organizations, notably, as a Founding Member, Spanish Club of Guam in the 1950's, Founding Member of the Chapter of Bataan-Corregidor Veterans of Guam in the 1960's, Founding Member, Past President and Director, Filipino Community of Guam as well as Past Officer and Director, Filipino American Chamber of Commerce, Guam Chapter, Founding Member, Guam Audubon Society, Founding Member, University of Santo Tomas Alumni Association of Guam and Past Vice President, Guam Girls Scout Council, all in the 1960's; and

Whereas, in his passing, the late Honorable Judge Ramon Valero Diaz joins his late son, Carl, and will be forever missed by his loving wife Josefina, his children Marilu, Mariles, Marilen, Maribel, Mariann, Maricar, Tony, Vince and Ramon Jr., as well as numerous grandchildren; now, therefore be it

**RESOLVED**, that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'Trentai Unu Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, recognize and commend the late Honorable Judge Ramon Valero Diaz for the many contributions he has made to the people of Guam and to the preservation of peace and justice; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Speaker and the Chairperson of the Committee of Rules certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to the family of the late Honorable Judge Ramon Valero Diaz and to the Honorable Edward B. Calvo, I Måga'lahen Guåhan.
