Relative to expressing the sense of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*'s expenditure priority of Compact Impact Act Funds for Fiscal Year 2012 to *I Maga'låhen Guåhan* and to the Secretary of Interior to support capital improvement projects and operations of various impacted government agencies and departments

Be it resolved by *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*:

Whereas, the Amended Compact of Free Association between the Republic of
 Belau, Republic of the Marshall Islands and the Federated States of Micronesia and the
 United States authorizes financial assistance to Hawaii, Guam, American Samoa, and the
 Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands; and

5 Whereas, the goal of this assistance is to provide (through the year 2023) Thirty 6 Million Dollars (\$30,000,000) in annual grants for the purpose of aiding in defraying 7 costs incurred as a result of increased demands placed on health, educational, social, or 8 public safety services as well as infrastructure related to such services to jurisdictions in 9 which qualified non-immigrants from the Republic of the Marshall Islands, the Federated 10 States of Micronesia, or the Republic of Palau have claimed residence; and

Whereas, the Guam Department of Education, the Guam Memorial Hospital, the Department of Public Health and Social Services, and the Guam Police Department are seeking funding relief to meet the increased demand in services provided to the public; and

Whereas, each jurisdiction is to provide a program plan to the Office of Insular
Affairs for the use of the funds prior to the awarding of the grant; and

Whereas, based on the population of qualified immigrants, Guam may apply for
 and be awarded approximately Sixteen Million Six Hundred Thirty-Six Thousand Dollars
 (\$16,636,000) in grant funds; and

4 Whereas, the Guam Department of Education school facilities have been 5 experiencing rapid deterioration and are in dire need of renovation, and

6 Whereas, the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority continues to experience 7 financial crises and seeks relief to pay for medical and pharmaceutical supplies vital to 8 the health and well-being of patients, and

9 Whereas, the Guam Police Department headquarters lease expires on September
30, 2011 and a new facility is needed to ensure public safety continuity; and

Whereas, the *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* continues to explore opportunities of relieving the General Fund which has been severely overstretched to subsidize projects and services that qualify for other funding sources, and

Whereas, *I Maga'låhen Guåhan* holds the highest authority and position charged with the responsibility for finding alternative solutions for improving systems, programs and services to improve the quality of life for the people he has been elected to serve; and

Whereas, it would only prove just and fit for *I Maga'låhen Guåhan* to consider
the matters mentioned above; and now, therefore, be it

19 **RESOLVED,** that *I Mina'trentai Unu Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby 20 present to the Honorable Edward J.B. Calvo, *I Maga'låhen Guåhan* and to the Honorable 21 Anthony M. Babauta, Assistant Secretary of the Interior for Insular Areas requests 22 funding of the costs for the aforementioned Capital Improvement Projects and Program 23 Support across those specific government of Guam agencies and departments from the 24 annual allocation of the Fiscal Year 2012 of Compact Aid Funds; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the sum of Seven Million One Hundred Thousand Dollars
 (\$7,100,000) is hereby earmarked to cover the School Leaseback Program for the Guam
 Department of Education; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the sum of Three Million Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$3,200,000) is hereby earmarked to renovate and repair the Luis P. Untalan Middle School in the village of Barrigada Guam, for the Guam Department of Education; and be it further

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RESOLVED, that the sum of Two Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars
 (\$2,500,000) is hereby earmarked to cover the Pharmaceutical Supplies for the Guam
 Memorial Hospital Authority; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the sum of Two Million Three Hundred Thirty-Six Thousand
Dollars (\$2,336,000) is hereby available to cover payments to the Guam Memorial
Hospital Authority for the Medically Indigent Program; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the sum of Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$750,000)
is hereby available to cover the lease or construction of facilities for the Guam Police
Department; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the sum of Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$750,000)
 is hereby available to cover Pharmaceutical and Medical Supplies for the Guam
 Community Health Centers at the Department of Public Health and Social Services; and
 be it further
