3 WHEREAS, *I Liheslatura*, through the adoption of Resolution No. 308-

- 7 Centric Government Reporting Initiative, which was launched a few years

ago with the intent to foster innovative means of communication between
 governments and their citizenry; and

WHEREAS, UOG Professor Dr. Doreen Crisostomo first introduced her students to the Citizen-Centric Government Reporting Initiative in her Spring 2009 BA401 "Government Accounting" class. Dr. Crisostomo incorporated the initiative into her syllabus to complement classroom learning and give her students exposure to real-world experiences through interacting with our local government agencies to compile various citizencentric reports (CCR) for each agency involved; and

WHEREAS, last year AGA National kicked-off their Fifth (5th) Annual 10 11 Challenge, inviting Government Case the best undergraduate accounting/financial management/business students in the country to 12 compete. Student teams were to collaboratively analyze and offer a written 13 response to a case centered on how a U.S. city government creates a CCR; 14 15 and

16 WHEREAS, UOG Accounting Professor Dr. Doreen Crisostomo 17 formed a four (4) member student team from her Fall 2011 BA401 18 "Government Accounting" class, of which Ms. Amber Castro was a

member. Under the guidance of Dr. Crisostomo, the team of Castro, Ms.
Ruren Clemente, Mr. Garry Yeoh and Mr. Edward Brobesong entered into
the AGA National's competition to prepare a citizen-centric report for the
city of Alexandria, Virginia, to include a paper that summarizes the criteria
and the justification the team used to decide what information to include
and exclude in the performance report; and

WHEREAS, the UOG team of Castro, Yeoh, Brobesong, and Clemente 7 8 successfully placed as one of the top three (3) finalist teams, along with Old Dominion University and University of North Carolina at Pembroke; and 9 10 WHEREAS, all finalist teams were awarded scholarships to attend the AGA's Tenth (10th) Annual National Leadership Conference in Washington, 11 12 DC, which the UOG team accepted; and 13 WHEREAS, I Liheslatura, through the adoption of Resolution No. 308-31 (LS) recognized, commended and offered its well wishes for the UOG 14 team, which attended the Conference from February 16-18, 2012; and 15 WHEREAS, all three (3) finalist teams presented their finalized 16

17 solutions on February 16, 2012 before a panel of judges comprised of federal,

state and local government leaders; corporate partners; and chief financial
 officers; and

14	themselves, for our university and for our island; now, therefore, be it
