Relative to requesting that Guam Delegate to Congress Madeline Z. Bordallo secure authorization and funding for a United States Department of Labor (USDOL) Job Corps Center in Guam.

1 BE IT RESOLVED BY Ι MINA'TRENTAI UNU NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN: 2

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Labor's "Job Corps" 3 is a no-cost, educational and vocational training program that helps 4 5 young people (ages 16 through 24) improve the quality of their lives through vocational and academic training, by providing them with a 6 safe, drug-free environment where they can take advantage of the 7 8 resources provided to gain skills that can be used to secure meaningful 9 employment; and

## WHEREAS, beginning in 1964, and for nearly Fifty (50) years, Job 10 Corps has been training young adults for meaningful careers, currently 11 operating One Hundred Twenty-Five (125) Job Corps Centers in every 12

state, the District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico, however there is no Job 1 2 Corps Center in Guam; and

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WHEREAS,

development training approaches that integrate the teaching of academic and vocational employability skills with social competencies through a variety of both classroom and practical learning experiences, that help to prepare young people for stable, long-term, high-paying jobs; and 8

WHEREAS, the Job Corps program provides individualized 9 10 instruction to meet the needs of each student, utilizing standard 11 eligibility criteria, while focusing on the core competencies of each 12 individual student in academic, vocational, information technology, employability and independent living skills; and 13

WHEREAS, given the high rate of unemployment in Guam, our 14 15 territory is an ideal location for the services of a Job Corps center, to 16 provide young persons with the guidance and training necessary to secure meaningful, long-term employment; and 17

WHEREAS, the median age of Guam's population is considerably 18 lower than that of the 50 states, with Guam's males an average of 6.6 19 years younger, and Guam's females 8.4 years younger than their 20
