- 3 WHEREAS, on July 21<sup>st</sup>, 1953, while stationed in Florida, Mr. Jack and Mrs.
- 4 Concepcion Barrett became the proud parents of Elizabeth, the youngest of three
- children; and 5
- WHEREAS, upon settling in Guam, Elizabeth graduated from the Academy of 6
- 7 Our Lady of Guam in 1971 and was a recipient of a Professional and Technical
- Scholarship to attend Chaminade College in Hawaii, from 1971 to 1973, and further at 8
- 9 the University of San Francisco where Elizabeth graduated with a Bachelor of Arts
- 10 Degree in Political Science in 1974; and
- WHEREAS, continuing her graduate education under the government of 11
- 12 Guam's scholarship program, Elizabeth earned her Juris Doctorate Degree from the
- University of Santa Clara School of Law in 1979; and 13

WHEREAS, upon returning to Guam, Elizabeth married Mr. Daniel Anderson 1 2 on January 1, 1980 and in the years following were blessed with three children: Scott, 3 Thomas and Angela; and WHEREAS, Elizabeth started her career in public service at the Superior Court 4 5 of Guam as a Law Clerk intern, and was admitted into the Guam Bar Association on January 5, 1980, and later became the Legal Counsel for the Department of Education 6 7 from 1981 to 1984; and 8 WHEREAS, in 1987, then Governor Joseph F. Ada nominated Attorney Barrett-Anderson to the post of Attorney General of Guam and on July 23, 1987, with 9 10 legislative confirmation, Attorney Barrett-Anderson became Guam's first female 11 Attorney General; and 12 WHEREAS, from 1987 to 1994, as Attorney General of Guam, Attorney 13 General Barrett-Anderson established the Family Division within the Office of the Attorney General to strengthen Guam's Child Support Enforcement Program, directed 14 attention to the needs of abused children to address a growing juvenile problem, was 15 16 instrumental in the enactment of Guam's Consumer Protection Law, modernized 17 Guam's Notary Public Statute, was selected as Director of the Year in recognition of 18 her innovative ideas and for strengthening the Prosecutorial and Civil Divisions of the 19 Office of the Attorney General of Guam, and was a recipient of the Achievement Award by the National Association of Notary Public; and 20 WHEREAS, in November 1984, Attorney Barrett-Anderson was elected by the 21 people of Guam to serve as a Senator in the Twenty-third (23<sup>rd</sup>) Guam Legislature and 22 Senator Barrett-Anderson was re-elected to serve in the Twenty-fourth (24th) Guam 23 Legislature where she served as the Chairperson for the Committee on Judiciary, 24 Public Safety and Consumer Protection; and 25

WHEREAS, on November 7, 1997, Senator Barrett-Anderson was nominated by then Governor Carl T.C. Gutierrez to serve as a Superior Court of Guam Judge, and on April 14, 1998, Superior Court Judge Nominee Elizabeth Barrett-Anderson was sworn in after confirmation by the Twenty-fifth (25<sup>th</sup>) Guam Legislature and became the seventh Judge on the Superior Court of Guam, assigned to the Family Court; and

WHEREAS, during her tenure on the Bench, Judge Barrett-Anderson worked closely with Superior Court of Guam Presiding Judge Alberto C. Lamorena III in developing Guam's Therapeutic Court approach to address Family Violence, Drug & Alcohol Related Crimes, Juvenile Justice and is credited with the creation of the Driving While Influenced (DWI) Court. Judge Barrett-Anderson was also instrumental in the establishment of the Rules of Procedure and Practice in the field of domestic violence and received national recognition for her work. Judge Barrett-Anderson also served on the Board of Directors of the National Association of Drug Court Professionals and as a member of the Federal Advisory Council on Juvenile Justice; and

WHEREAS, Judge Barrett-Anderson has contributed over thirty (30) years of service to the people of Guam through her tenure as a Law Clerk with the Superior Court of Guam, Legal Counsel for the Department of Education, Attorney General of Guam, elected Senator and Honorable Superior Court Judge; now therefore, be it

**RESOLVED,** that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'Trentai Unu Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people of Guam, commend and congratulate the Honorable Judge Elizabeth Barrett-Anderson on the occasion of her retirement from the Unified Judiciary of Guam and the Government of Guam; does express a most sincere *Un Dångkolo Na Si Yu'os Ma'åse'* in recognition of over thirty (30) years of service and community contribution to the
