WHEREAS, the Salvation Army, founded in 1865, is a religious and charitable organization providing help and hope to thousands of people around the world; and

WHEREAS, in the last twenty (20) years, the Salvation Army Guam Corps has built a network of programs to provide services to those who are most in need of help; and

WHEREAS, Lieutenants Ted and Debby Horwood first brought the Salvation Army organization to Guam in 1992 just before Typhoon Omar; and

WHEREAS, in July 1995, Captains Dave and Linda Harmon arrived as new Corps Officers for The Salvation Army Guam Corps; and

WHEREAS, from June 2006 to June 2007, Majors Brian and Leticia Saunders served as Corps Officers, followed by Captains Thomas and Christina Taylor who currently serve as Corps Officers of The Salvation Army Guam Corps:

WHEREAS, the Lighthouse Recovery Center, a 16-bed residence, opened in 1998 and has since grown to expand its program in April 14, 2009 to serve more men with substance abuse issues by moving into a state of the art facility, increasing their bed capacity to 30; and

WHEREAS, The Salvation Army Guam Corps oversees the Lighthouse Recovery Center's annual Community Thanksgiving Feast serving over 1,100 persons in need; and

WHEREAS, The Salvation Army was recently awarded funds from the Department of Housing & Urban Development's Continuum of Care Homeless Assistance Grants to operate a 4 bedroom group home for dual diagnosed homeless clients who graduated from the Lighthouse Recovery Center's six month program; and

WHEREAS, other Salvation Army programs include youth activities, after school activities, day camp, summer camp, and Youth Councils established both in Guam and Chuuk, whereby a five-day Salvation Army International Youth Conference was held in 2005; and

WHEREAS, in addition to the many services they provide, The Salvation Army Guam Corps operates the Family Services Center which provides emergency assistance to families in need of food, clothing, rent, or utilities; and

WHEREAS, the Family Services Center also provides food boxes to over 1,400 persons, toys to over 1,500 children around Christmas, and participates in the Guam Homeless Coalition's annual island-wide Homeless Count and Passport to Services; and

WHEREAS, the Guam Corps operates the Salvation Army Thrift Store which has gone from a small store in Harmon, to its present two-story, 3,500 square foot location in Tamuning, offering low-cost clothing, furniture, and a variety of other household goods to the community; and

WHEREAS, since their establishment in Guam, The Salvation Army Guam 1 Corps has partnered with other community organizations and businesses which 2 enrich life in Guam, such as the Guam Symphony Society, the Guam Territorial 3 Band, the Rotary Club of Tumon Bay, the Guam Women's Club, the Guam 4 Council of Women's Club, the Soroptimist International of Guam, the Guam Naval 5 Officers' Spouse Connection, the Andersen Officers Souses Club, Chinese Ladies 6 Association, Korean Women's Association of Guam, KUAM Care Force, Chinese 7 Chamber of Commerce Guam, Marine Corps Toys for Tots, the Guam Homeless 8 Coalition and the Council on Homelessness, Bank of Hawaii, Citibank, First 9 Hawaiian Bank, Wells Fargo Financial; and 10 WHEREAS, in addition to its regular offerings, the Salvation Army also 11 coordinates with local and federal authorities to offer help during typhoons and 12 other disasters through its Emergency Disaster Services Team; and 13 WHEREAS, the Salvation Army Guam Corps have participated in 14 numerous disaster and relief efforts, including the Korean Airlines crash, 15 Supertyphoon Paka in 1997, Typhoon Chata'an and Supertyphoon Pongsona in 16 2002, and the relief efforts to assist Kurdish refugees in 1996 and Burmese 17 refugees in 2000; now, therefore be it; 18 RESOLVED, that I Mina' Trentai Unu Na Liheslaturan Guåhan does 19 hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, commend and congratulate The Salvation 20 Army Guam Corps as they celebrate their twenty (20) years of dedicated service on 21 Guam; and be it further
