Relative to encouraging the accurate location attribution of the Challenger Deep in order to create the widespread awareness of Guam, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands and Micronesia and secure potential economic benefits for the people of Guam, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands and Micronesia.

## BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES I

- MINA'TRENTAI UNU NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:
- 3 **WHEREAS**, the Challenger Deep, at thirty-five thousand, seven
- 4 hundred fifty-five (35,755) feet, is the deepest known point in the world, and
- 5 whose depth surpasses the height of Mt. Everest by an incredible one (1)
- 6 mile; and,

- WHEREAS, the Challenger Deep has been and continues to be one
- 8 of the most newsworthy of the earth's natural features to be explored in the
- 9 last sixty (60) years; and,
- WHEREAS, the global brands of National Geographic and
- Hollywood director James Cameron and similar individuals and entities,
- their production partners, content distributors, financial partners, licensees
- and licenses, have established potentially lucrative business ventures by
- exploring the Challenger Deep; and,

1	WHEREAS, no known residual structure or stakeholder plan has		
2	been established, offered or required of National Geographic and		
3	Hollywood director James Cameron and similar individuals and entities,		
4	their production partners, content distributors, financial partners, licensees		
5	and licenses, on behalf of the people of Micronesia whose homeland has		
6	encompassed the Marianas Trench for thousands of years; and,		
7	WHEREAS, Guam has always served as a launching point to		
8	exploration of the Challenger Deep as it lies only two hundred (200) nautical		
9	miles from Guam's coastline, beginning in 1958 with the first exploration by		
10	Jacques Piccard of Switzerland and the US Navy, resulting in a successful		
11	dive by the bathyscaphe Trieste on 23 January 1960; and,		
12	WHEREAS, additionally, survey of the lexicon of communications		
13	online and in print suggests a critical lack of attribution to Guam, the		
14	Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI) and Micronesia as		
15	the region encompassing the location of the Challenger Deep, which serves		
16	to inhibit Guam, the CNMI and Micronesia from deriving potential		
17	economic benefits from their geographic location in relation to the Trench;		
18	and,		
19	WHEREAS, Guam, as a US Territory, and the CNMI, as a		
20	Commonwealth of the United States, are excluded from establishing and		
21	collecting fees directly from any exploration of the Marianas Trench and the		
22	Challenger Deep; and,		
23	WHEREAS, the natural resources of Micronesia should, as a matter		
24	of ethics and conscience, be managed by the people of Micronesia who are		
25	entitled to secure sustained financial benefits and royalties from National		
26	Geographic, James Cameron and similar individuals and entities, their		
27	production partners, content distributors, financial partners, licensees and		

- licenses, and the revenues they will reap from their exploration of the
  Marianas Trench and the Challenger Deep; and,
- WHEREAS, Guam, the CNMI and Micronesia currently lack the negotiation capabilities or capacity to effect this rightful financial relationship, and as an example of how a country can benefit economically from their natural features, the government of Nepal charges fees ranging from \$25,000 for a one-member expedition to \$70,000 for seven members to
- WHEREAS, the People of Guam, the CNMI and Micronesia deserve to be compensated by the exploitation of their natural treasures and resources, inasmuch as others, such as *National Geographic* and James Cameron will surely benefit; and,

- WHEREAS, in the area of journalistic diligence, the Challenger Deep is not routinely nor respectfully referenced as in Micronesia in the same way California is routinely referenced with the San Andreas Fault, Arizona is routinely referenced with the Grand Canyon, Yosemite National Park is routinely clearly stated as being located in California, etc.; and,
- WHEREAS, this journalistic and scientific disregard of Guam's, the
  CNMI's and Micronesia's factual geographic location in relation to the
  location of the Challenger Deep, impairs the efforts of Guam, the CNMI and
  Micronesia to attain global recognition and develop sustainable economies;
  now, therefore, be it
  - **RESOLVED,** that *I Mina'trentai Unu Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* together with the Governor of Guam, work swiftly in a bi-partisan and unified effort to enforce said attribution in order to create the widespread awareness of Guam, the CNMI and Micronesia and secure potential economic benefits to the people of Guam, the CNMI and Micronesia; and to
